Leadership Cabinet Thursday, May 9, 2023

Yellowstone Presbytery Leadership Cabinet met via Zoom for its scheduled meeting on Tuesday, May 9, 2023, beginning at 1:00 p.m.

- **1. Opening:** Moderator Russ Kline called the meeting to order at 1:10 p.m. and led the team in opening prayer.
- 2. Quorum: A quorum was declared present.
- 3. Dwelling in the Word: John 21: 1-14 was read and discussed. Ideas generated included:
 - Jesus was telling the disciples to try something ne. When they did, good things happened.
 - Without Jesus in the picture our efforts are fruitless, or in this case, "fishless"
 - Jesus was cooking them breakfast. Jesus is often made known to disciples, including us, in the breaking of bread.
 - Why 153 fish? In the Sea of Galilee there were 153 species at the time of Jesus.
 - This passage is John speaking to the inclusiveness and service Jesus offers.

Caroline closed the time of Dwelling in the Word with prayer.

4. Minutes of the previous meeting:

- Action: A motion was made to approve the minutes of the April 12 meeting as amended, having taken George Goodrich off the attendance list. The motion was seconded and passed.
- **5. General Presbyter's Report**: (**Attachment A**) Kathy shared spiritual sightings she has experienced recently including a wonderful time spent in Pennsylvania at the 250th anniversary of First Presbyterian Church, Pittsburgh where we were both she and George were ordained and at the reunion for Ligonier Camp and Conf. Center. The trip was rejuvenating for her. She raised questions to the group: why does church matter? what Is important about church? and what Is/are the primary reason(s) for church? She is working hard with the Pastoral Ministry Team (PMT) and attended a meeting In Glendive sponsored by the ELCA where four denominations met to discuss the needs for ministry in eastern Montana and how we might work together to answer those needs.

She recommended all read the article "Christianity's Shifting Structure" from Presbyterian Outlook vol. 205, number 5, May 2023 and noted the webinar on May 31 concerning the denomination's new CLC program. Kathy will be taking some time off in June for her mother's funeral service June 9 than will travel to the east coast two weeks later for George's mother's service.

6. Team members shared where they have seen the Spirit at work recently:

- Melissa Bell is offering worship services at Stanford in May and enjoying the experience.
- Dave Thompson reported 1st Presbyterian Church of Billings had the largest Easter attendance in years and has 26 people in the new members class who will join the church on May 14. The church is hiring Nicole Ferestad Bodalski, a former Westminster Spires camp counselor, as their Christian Education Director. On a personal note, Dave's son John will graduate this month and will marry on June 2.
- Ashley Birk reports people stepping up and doing some old and some new things for the church. Family Promise Connections is being built and church leaders are re-thinking Sunday School, and deacons are starting hospital visits again.
- Julie Boksich reported a successful Easter egg hunt in Melrose with 14 children, some of whom wanted to come to church to learn more about Jesus. The church is now offering and after school program and hoping it will lead to Vacation Bible School and beyond.
- 7. Equipping Opportunities: Members are asked to think about possible equipping topics including how to recognize gifts in others and help them share those gifts, doing evangelism that builds on Ron Pyle's storytelling workshop. Julie suggested we consider two gatherings, one in Bozeman and one in Billings, that offer equipping workshops. We will also focus on equipping the saints at out LC/PMT retreat in the fall.
- 8. Presbytery meeting June 16-17: The meeting will be via Zoom and may be shortened to a 1-day meeting. PMT will need at least and hour and possibly 1¹/₄ hours. Rob Hagen of the Presbyterian Foundation wants some time. Kathy, Melissa, Mary Grace and Caroline will move forward with planning.
- **9. Personnel sub-committee:** Ashley Birk is the new chairperson. The group continues work on the personnel policy and has met with Deb in Bozeman concerning her part-time work at the office. She has been working about 1 hour per week but could do more.
- 10. Financial report: (Attachment B) The March financial reports are attached.
- **11. Clerk's report:** The Clerk attended the Synod minutes review in April, finished and delivered the memory book for George Goodrich, and continues work on the overtures, though almost all have passed already. She suggested the new Synod Clerk, Candice Sweet, be invited to the November presbytery meeting. She noted the McAllister sale is very near completion and recommends the LC approve the resolution concerning the sale included as **Attachment C**.

*Action: A motion was made and seconded to approve the resolution concerning the sale of the McAllister property. The motion passed.

Russ will sign the resolution and deliver it to Mark Parker's office in Billings.

12. Higher Education grants: (Attachment D) The team reviewed a slightly revised application for higher application grants. There is \$14,000 left in that account. Applications will be sent to our higher education institutions with a request to return the application by June 20th.

*Action: A motion was made and seconded to offer \$4,000 in higher education grants in 2023. The motion passed unanimously.

*Action: A motion was made and seconded to approve the amended application for higher education funds. The motion passed unanimously.

13. Summer Camp Update: (Attachment E) Summer camp will be held at the Hyalite Camp again this year. The bridge to Westminster Spires Camp is not repaired yet. Twenty campers have registered to date, and members are urged to recruit more as well as seek potential male counselors. It is possible that 1st Presbyterian of Billings could bus children from the east to the camp. If so, the new Christian Education Director at Billings 1st would be the contact person concerning the bus.

Spirit Sightings and Surprises

seems an apt heading to summarize and share with you just a few of the WIDE, astonishing, delightful, humbling and convicting, confirming, exciting and energizing, gifts, experiences and insights of my last month.

The last several weeks, in addition to our lives and ministries in Montana, George and I were invited back to Pennsylvania for wonderful celebrations.

~the 250th anniversary!! of First Presbyterian Church, Pittsburgh where we were both ordained (1978 & 1984) and where he was an Assoc. Pastor for youth and camping and I worked in camping and youth while in seminary

~Camp reunion for Ligonier Camp and Conf. Center (formerly First Presbyterian Church Camp) 109 years of visionary, remarkable example of anticipating, reflecting and imagining, and adapting Christian ministry for kids, families, adults out in God's creation!

Did we tell you we LOVE camping youth and family ministry and ministry, living in Christian community?!

~wedding in the family of dear friends, from hundreds of years of Mennonites, who have modeled for us Jesus' sacrificial love for their severely handicapped son, now 40.

~precious moments with a few of the seasoned saints whom God used mightily in our young lives. We are forever grateful, wiser, richer and blessed.

Some Spirit Sightings and Surprises include:

1.We could hug and rekindle bonds with some dear ones we had not seen in 40 years because we had learned, lived, loved, labored together in Christian ministry at camp/retreats/inner city rescue mission service over an injured or homesick camper, praying as we gathered hundreds of kids in a small basement during tornado warning (no cell phones! only a radio), agonized with kids and teens over the early death of a parent or fighting divorcing parents, were entrusted with deep fears and questions they felt safe to share, toilet papered people's houses dressed in dark clothes, spent New Year's Eve with MANY senior high students and some college staff at an inner city rescue mission where George spent a week incognito on study leave (ask him!) as we got to know and listened respectfully to the stories and wisdom of men living on the edges of life; encouraged fearful kids and staff up a 50'rock cliff and how to "TRUST the rope and your belayer" to repell down; huddled prayed and listened to the Spirit through one another for situations WAY beyond our years or human wisdom and witnessed the Spirit move in healing, life-giving power.

"As you are going, make disciples..." Mt. 28:18

"IF you are faithful in [what may seem] the little things you will be faithful in the large ones." Luke 16:10a NLT

Never underestimate or get distracted (seduced or enticed) from the foundational, transforming, people/community and world changing, core mutual discipleship practices of Jesus – prayer; 1-1 & small group *life-on-everyday life together;* rooted in and shaped by the Word written and the Word lived/Jesus; equipped and encourage to *live sent*, to join the Spirit already at work as we serve, share and embody the Good News, love... for the sake of the flourishing of the community and world and God's glory and Big purposes!

2.Why Church ? At the 250th banquet as I listened to the talk and later visiting with passionate, brilliant missionary, professor/dean seminary president Rev. Dr. Scott Sunquist (PCUSA) my mind was so alive, seeing so much of past, present and what still CAN be. Have you had that happen? With the intensely fallen, often anemic, institutionally or inwardly self-focused tendencies of the church in N. America of late, our well-intentioned but often half-hearted efforts at tweaking what most of the culture and world view as irrelevant at best or harmful at worst, need to be honestly examined, repented of!

We say "come", or "why aren't you coming"? They think, "Why Church?" So...

I long to be able to convey to and explore with you stories of congregations across the globe and across history, wondering what the Spirit may say to us now. Why Church? What is our CORE WHY , not merely the whats or hows?

The church in N. America truly needs voices from outside of ourselves, needs to mindset, heart, practices and skills, eyes and ears of missionaries if we are to become salty churches once again.

Sunquist's book, *Why Church? A Basic Introduction* distills the core of the church to 5 simple actions, illustrated with stories of congregations from around the globe.

" In a day and age when people say, 'I love Jesus, but I can do without the church,' Scott Sunquist reveals the error of such thinking. You cannot get Jesus without his church. It is his body and bride. With the mind of a scholar, the passion of a missionary, and the heart of a pastor, Scott provides both a correction and a call to return to the sense and sensibilities of the initial followers of Jesus who *turned the world upside down*." -- Claude Alexander, bishop, The Park Church, Charlotte, NC.

When I invited him, Scott said he would be open to further exploring his coming out to Montana and to possibly share with us while here, likely combining a few things at once.

The church is God's BEST answer for this world and people God loves! God ordained that the motley community of disciples, full, empowered and being transformed into Christ-likeness by the Holy Spirit, to be God's vessels, primary outpost, signpost, Jesus with skin on answer, incarnating Jesus in such a way that others wonder, ask, and we give an answer for the hope within us I Pet. 3:5-17. We must let the Spirit re-shape us to be all we are created to be "for such a time as this' in the history of our communities, country and world desperately seeking.

3.Discern your gifts and God's calling and follow Jesus! The Spirit's enables obedience, courage and grace as needed, and can work all things for God's good, redemptive purposes and *Kairos*.

I could not declare myself an MDiv or come under care of session in the 70's until they ordained their first woman elder. Those aspects of waiting and that season were painful, and used by God. Many stories. And redeemed relationships over the years when I sought to keep the main thing the main thing. Three 60ish women came up and told me thank you for how my following my calling to be a woman pastor in the late 70's early 80's, with Jesus's love, passion and courage has empowered them in a similar calling or at unfortunate discriminatory moments. Louise, one of my camp counselor staff, is now a pastor on the staff of Pittsburgh Presbytery! Julie could choose a different church for her family after ugliness... A PCA pastor/professor I had just met, told me as we left a spirited conversation, something to the effect that I was the worst nightmare for him and those who believe as he does about women leaders in the church, as he experienced my joyful, Christ-centered, biblically rooted, articulate strong worship leadership at the start of the anniversary worship service. It's always, all about Jesus!

4. Gratitude! Always thank EVERYONE for EVRYTHING!

As George and I led the opening part of the worship service together in the pulpit (deeply moving in itself after the history there) and we sang The Church's One Foundation is Jesus Christ Her Lord with the most glorious organ in that magnificent cathedral structure, I looked across the saints gathered and suddenly began to be aware of the

saints we walked with there and in other seasons of our lives who were joining in this glorious worship of our Triune God across all space, place and time.

How glad we were to get to hug some dear remaining saints like dear 90 something Lew on his walk who loved and served inner city kids in Boys Club for at least 40 years Jim the lawyer in a wheelchair, after a severe stroke, Neil and Anne in the retirement community, Walt, Martha, John and Anne and so many others.

We are grateful to Mentor pastor/camp director Rev. Woody Strodel for this admonition above in our first months in Pittsburgh.

And, oh, there is so much more, for later.

Could you join me in praying for restored health, healthy boundaries and God's provision for the landslide of things for ministry and person life, that I can find the time needed to continue the reflecting and writing the Spirit wants me to do?

Remember (and celebrate), Reflect, Re-Store/Re-story, Re-frame, Respond to the Spirit's promptings, invitations and opportunities.

PMT – A great deal happening - transitions approaching, under way and lived into in the feelings and complexities, and frustrations, and God's opportunities. Several searches underway or will be.

A fruitful ecumenical conversation in Glendive May 5-6 with 5 mainline bodies represented. Our team, Caroline, Jamie, Neva, Nancy Pehl, Charley Blom also joined, were frankly some of the most prepared and insightful and creative voices of leadership, partnership and possibility in the group of about 25.

Met and explored ideas with several people including a Lutheran Sr. pastor, Luther LPA, A Methodist pastor from Tonga who loves small towns, Rev. Tony Clark, new UCC Conf minister.

Networks and Partnerships are part of the new ways in which life in church and community is springing up and supported.

I am attending and/or preaching in a few churches, often those in transition, Manhattan, Bozeman (June 4)

CLC – connecting, discerning, calling rolling out and training for the NEW CLC (Church Leadership Connection, pastor church dating service!) National Webinar May 31 I will be attending (for presbytery staff & COM mod's) Will be recorded and archived for Mid Council Leader Use. This has been and will consume a lot of learning and interpretive time and energy for me, Caroline and all involved in these process

Rev. Brent Long installed in UCC church in Big Timber June 4 @ 4 pm. All invited. I am preaching a homily.

Camping and Youth - See Daniel's report.

Synod – Sept meeting will include Execs as well as commissioners. They want a 5 minute video from each presbytery to highlight the Spirit at work there.

Personal – Many blessings. We celebrated with Gillian as she was awarded Excellence in Teaching award by MSU! We continue to live into this new season for us. My mother's service will be June 9 @ 4 in Park County-Paradise Valley near the cemetery. At Mountain Bible Church. Any welcome to come. Prayers for all the prep and family complexities welcomed.

Be it resolved: At the same meeting the Presbytery voted to elect an Administrative Commission to handle the sale to the McCallister Church Property. The Administrative Commission elected consisted of Dan Krebill Moderator, Charlie Mandeville and Dan Beekman to serve on the McAllister Property Sale Commission.

Be it resolved: The Leadership, meeting on May 9, 2023, acting as Trustees for Yellowstone Presbytery, authorizes the sale of the McAllister Church Property for the sum of \$150,000.00 and authorizes the Stated Clerk, Caroline Fleming, to sign all closing documents on the sale of the McAllister property on behalf of the Presbytery Corporation.

- Our team will be meeting over Zoom for five Wednesday nights starting May 17th, to plan, pray and get ready for camp. Given where our team lives and since we can't get to camp early and have a true team training/retreat, this is what we'll need to do.
