Leadership Cabinet Tuesday, December 12, 2023

Yellowstone Presbytery Leadership Cabinet met via Zoom for its scheduled meeting on Tuesday, December 12, 2023, at 1:00 p.m.

Opening: Moderator Russ Kline called the meeting to order with prayer at 1:05 p.m.

Dwelling in the Word: Kathy led Dwelling in the Word having people read 4 scripture passages: Isaiah 9: 2b, Genesis 16: 13, Matthew 1:23, and Matthew 9:36. Passages referred to God seeing, Jesus seeing, The light shining, and us seeing God. Members shared what it means to be truly seen by others. It is comforting, yet to be seen by God who sees all our flaws can be scary and comforting at the same time since we know we have God's unconditional love. Questions for all: How might we seek to truly see as God sees? How can we look for God in others and know they are created and loved as we are? Do we choose not to see? Dave mentioned Andy Andrew's book <u>The Noticer</u>. How can we help each other to be good noticers?

Members shared Spirit Sightings: Julie's church held its first "Parents' Night Out" with great success. Caroline shared her day of game with the grandson and Jack's compliment about how well she played with him.

Quorum: A quorum was declared present.

Minutes of November meeting: There is a mistake concerning Board of Pensions notifications on page 1. It will be corrected, and the team will review and approve the November minutes at the January meeting.

General Presbyter Report: (Attachment A) Kathy's complete report is attached. Please read it. Highlights from her report include:

the formation of a new task force, "Uncovering Treasure and Sharing the Light: Evangelism and planting new churches/worshipping communities/fresh expressions of church." Anyone interested in participating can contact Russ or Julie Boksich.

Planning for the CLP program through Synod and Dubuque is nearly complete. Classes start in January.

Ideas to explore for mission and service: who might we partner with to expand our mission in the world.

Leadership Retreat Update: At least three members cannot attend a retreat in January. After conversation, it has been decided to postpone the retreat until after Easter. A grant may be applied for to pay expenses incurred if the retreat is held at some kind of retreat center. Plans are in progress.

"Uncovering Treasure and Sharing the Light" is the title of a new task force that will focus on evangelism, new worshipping communities, and fresh expressions of church. Russ Kline and Julie Boksich initiated this and plan to travel to churches, dine with them and discuss ways the church can evangelize and revitalize. Dinner Church is one idea that will be presented. They hope to equip the church in storytelling using material from Ron Pyle's workshop.

PMT & CRE Dubuque/Synod program: Kathy reported that Synod is having a hard time getting people together to finalize details for the program. The cost of each course is \$150.00, and January 9, 2024 is the last day to register for the program.

FPC Billings Youth Mission Trip: Dave Thompson reported they are planning a youth mission trip to Alaska in June 2024. Cost per person will be \$1200 to \$1400. Nicole Bodalski is the contact person for the event.

Treasurer's Report: Ric Reported that LC has to decide into which category to move funds from the sale of both Geyser and Harlowton churches. Amounts from the sales are \$8068.00 and \$9409.58, respectively. An anonymous doner has offered to match year-end gifts to the presbytery up to \$10,000. Kathy will send a letter to all churches that includes information about the match.

Clerk's Report: Caroline reported that all churches should have received information concerning per capita and all year-end reporting. She will send a follow-up letter to clerks asking if they have received the information. May reports are due January 31st. The portal for reporting statistics is open until mid-February.

Upcoming meetings: <u>January 9</u> February 13

Announcements: Kathy noted the need for a Vice Moderator of Presbytery to fill the vacancy on LC. Rep/Nom might also select a person to fill the vacancy who can learn about the workings and responsibilities of LC and Presbytery. That person might then be willing to step into a leadership role.

*Action: A motion was made and seconded to adjourn the LC meeting and move to a corporate meeting of the Trustees of the Corporation. The motion passed unanimously.

General Presbyter Report to Leadership Cabinet Yellowstone Presbytery Dec. 12, 2023

Leadership Cabinet - Leadership in my position involves **providing** Christ-centered, relational, visionary leadership, (with leaders in the presbytery), which considers context and the immediate, transitional and longer term.

A primary focus on listening, loving, learning from the Holy Spirit, others, what the Spirit is already doing, equipping and building the capacity within both the presbytery's Ministry Teams, and our churches, cultivating spiritual depth, curiosity and imagination.

Identifying, equipping and training, working with leaders in or for existing and new churches/fresh expressions, and with an eye towards being missional and fruitful in their current contexts and opportunities. This pertains to our vision and work of LC and PMT and other areas.

Follow up and work in a wide range of areas including the CRE program: Launch and have ongoing active involvement, myself and others from YP, with the Dubuque Theological Seminary/Synod of the Rocky Mountains pioneering partnership program for training potential Commissioned Ruling Elders/Lay Pastors as well as lay leaders seeking further education and training in some specific areas.

I did extensive reflection and preparation and met with the Personnel subgroup for my annual review including priorities and goals. I am grateful for the great deal of time and work each of them give.

New Task Force meeting: Uncovering Treasure and Sharing the Light: Evangelism and planting new churches/worshipping communities/fresh expressions of church. I have met with this Task Force several times. Focusing this next year on 1. building the foundation and

2. Exploration and equipping for various ways of doing Dinner church. 3. Equipping all in YP to share this stories and experiences of faith in and with Jesus and make use of the excellent Ron Pyle videos.

We hear from others who are glad for this equipping emphasis and opportunity, commenting on how needed it is for their church and community and why.

Joint Leadership Retreat - I have had several conversations or consultations with various presbytery leaders and Caroline about this. Tis the season to adapt and practice agility and compassionate leadership.

Pastoral Ministry Team - I am grateful for Neva and Debbie's experienced leadership as excellent partners with the wide range of proactive as well as responsive responsibilities, along with good folks serving. Losing 3 of our best team members is a loss for Caroline and me, PMT and the presbytery and congregations. A huge thank you to Debbie Blackburn, Linda Smith and Kimmy Briggs. We are glad Julie Boksich will be joining the Team along with Steve Hundley. PMT continues to have a great deal going on - pastors and CRE's and leaders, with varying levels with churches in transitions, interims, searches at various stages on the journey, churches exploring and experimenting with new ways of worship, becoming more intergenerational, connecting with and serving their communities, work with other judicatory heads on some of our churches and their needs,

A great deal has been needed to be done with both Dubuque, Synod staff and our folks on the CRE program. See above. Still awaiting updates.

The multiple challenges in and with the performance of the CLC in Louisville and total lack of response/communication from many EPs across the country. continue while some are experiencing some good results I hear. Here, this has negative impacts such as increased time and frustration for me, some PMT members, PNC's and pastors. More on this in the new year.

Rep/Nom Ministry Team - I continue to attend the meetings as they have worked and prayed diligently. We owe Jody McDevitt a HUGE thank you for her leadership and diligence with the Team. Pray for Terry Johnson (RE Dillon) whose husband is battling cancer.

Mission and service - We are a part of the entire body of Christ which includes not only locally but globally and need to continue to embody that, a crucial part of our vision statement and be providing more in these areas partnering with those gifted in these areas. With changes in leaders and in churches over the years, this has slipped. I have had a specific request lately, and our congregations need the visibility, interpretation and partnerships in this area. Who do you know who may be gifted and passionate about this?

- 1. <u>Partnership and Work in the Middle East</u> seminary in Cairo, Dr. Anne Zaki, and the important and generative work of the Presbyterian Outreach Foundation (one of the many partner organizations who work with the PCUSA, many there used to be with our World Mission. That work is very contextual and important. Kimmy Briggs has traveled and served with them.
- 2. I have been in touch with folks at **FPC Billing**s regarding Dave Thompson's gracious offer to open up <u>their</u> <u>youth mission trip to Alaska</u>. It is slated for the end of June. Look for further info. Contact Youth Director Nichole Bodalski.
- 3. Exploring strengthening our past, very active ties with Revs. Paul and Lydia Neshangwe and the Presbyterian Church in

Zimbabwe. Paul is a national and local pastor and leader, has suffered at the hands of the government for his faith and speaking and acting for just and nonviolent treatment of citizens, and much more. They had to flee to the US for several years. In addition to the partnership with Denver, Yellowstone initiated a partnership with them. He has spoken at the Yellowstone Glacier Convocation here in the last 15 years and FPC Billings and Bozeman are among the churches who have had him visit and partnered with him. We zoomed with him during a presbytery meeting several years ago.

"Rev Dr. Lydia is an ordained minister from Zimbabwe where she ministers in a diverse congregation at St Columbas Presbyterian Church in the mountainous city of Mutare. She is the first Black female Moderator of the Uniting Presbyterian Church in Southern Africa (UPCSA), a transnational denomination in four countries: South Africa, Zambia, DRC, and Zimbabwe. She is an ecumenist at heart and is currently the Moderator of the Council for World Mission (CWM), a global organization that brings together 32 church denominations from around the world. She serves as the Chairperson of the Zimbabwe Council of Churches (ZCC) Advisory Board, and the

Zimbabwe Country Coordinator for Hope's Promise, an orphan care organization." She is the new moderator, first female, for the All Africa Conference of Churches.
