Leadership Cabinet Tuesday, April 9, 2024

Yellowstone Presbytery Leadership Cabinet met via Zoom for its scheduled meeting on Tuesday, April 9, 2024, beginning at 1:00 p.m.

Cabinet members present:

MWS Ashley Birk RE Russ Kline, Moderator MWS Karolee Larson MWS Mary Grace Reynolds MWS Dave Thompson Members excused: RE Melissa Bell MWS Jamie Schmeling

Others present:

MWS Kathy Goodrich, General Presbyter, RE Caroline Fleming, Stated Clerk.

- 1. **Opening:** Moderator Russ Kline called the meeting to order, and Karolee Larson began the meeting with prayer at 1:00 p.m.
- 2. Quorum: A quorum was declared present.
- **3.** Moderator Russ added an item to the agenda: discussion on overture going to General Assembly about amending the Book of Order to include sexual orientation and Gender identity among categories against which the church doesn't discriminate. By consensus, members agreed to include the discussion following the General Presbyter's report.
- 4. Dwelling in the Word: Members read Luke 10: 25-37, the parable of the Good Samaritan and discussed implications for our lives. Though personal safety is important, we might do better at offering resources to people who seek the church's and our assistance. Living our compassion seems to be more difficult in our less-than-safe world. Scheming is widespread, and we don't want to misuse resources. How can God help us to have the compassion needed to assist those who need it? How do we see with "Jesus eyes?" How do churches wrestle with the vast amount of human need in the world today? Kathy ended the discussion with prayer.
- **5. Spirit Sightings**: Several Maundy Thursday services and activities were Spirit-filled. Karolee shared God's presence at the Rescue Mission where she and others washed feet. Kathy shared serving Communion to all, including young children, at Manhattan Easter Sunday. Julie shared God in the midst of Easter brunch served by students.
- **6.** February minutes: Members reviewed minutes from the February 13 meeting. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as printed. The motion passed.

- 7. Gen Presbyter report: (Attachment A) Kathy shared that BOP is rolling out its new pension plan, but the rollout has been erratic. She will get a letter out to people tomorrow about it and sharing that BOP Church Consultant Christine Long will be in Yellowstone Presbytery May 16 and 17 for private consultations and for a presentation at the presbytery meeting. Kathy also noted that General Assembly registration is open, that there is a lot of work at the Synod level particularly with the CLP/CRE courses through Dubuque, and that she has been asked to please remain on the Rocky Mountain College Board. The full report is attached, and you are encouraged to read it.
- 8. Overture going to General Assembly: Dave Thompson shared his concerns about the overture being sent to General Assembly that will amend the Book of Order to include sexual orientation and gender identity among categories against which the church doesn't discriminate and the mandate it includes that candidates must be examined about their ability to commit to fulfilling all requirements expressed in the constitutional questions and principle of participation, representation and non-discrimination proposed in F-1.0403. Team members shared thoughts, realizing that this overture may or may not pass a General Assembly vote. If it does not, we will not see it again. If it does pass, it will come to all presbyteries for discussion and vote as to whether or not to amend the Book of Order.
- **9. Presbytery Meeting Reflection:** Dinner Church was very nice. Technology worked well and the hybrid meeting went smoothly. In the future, we need to be sure that people attending in person must always use a microphone. Perhaps having them step to a podium would be helpful, as would finding a good camera angle so those online could see speakers' faces.
- **10. Leadership/PMT Retreat:** The long-planned for retreat will be held at Westminster Spires in mid-August. Children are welcome and Nocole Boldaski will offer a children's program.
- 11. May 17 Presbytery meeting: The meeting will be held in Dillon with a hybrid option. Christine Long of BOP will present before lunch and have time for Q & A after lunch. The planning team is Kathy, Caroline, Mary Grace and Dave. People who arrive in Dillon the night before can enjoy "dinner at Daniels." Business time will be as short as possible so the meeting can conclude at 4:00 p.m.
- **12. Update on Required New Policies:** Kathy is collecting samples and will get them to Caroline next week.
- **13. Treasurer report: (Attachment B)** With the year 2024 16.7% complete, our Administrative budget income is at 65% and budget expenses are at 26%. Program budget income is at 24% and budget expenses are at 8%. Both budgets are on track.
- 14. Personnel: Ashley and Kathy met with Deb Jackson at Bozeman last week. Deb is willing to add an hour or two of time for Presbytery work which can include things like newsletter and

website postings. The updated Personnel Policy is still in process. The team will meet Thursday, April 11.

- 15. Dubuque/Synod CRE Cohort: Yellowstone has 12 students enrolled.
- 16. Clerk's Report: The Clerk continues to work to dispose of the land Presbytery holds in Valley County. She is working o the 2024 required boundary training with Janet Potter, Chairperson of the Glacier COM, Kathy, and Chuck Carlson. The plan is for two presentations, same material, from Attorney Mark Bassingthwaite.

17. Announcements:

- Next Presbytery Meeting is in Dillon on May 17 with hybrid option.
- Currently, the bridge is out between Twin Bridges and Dillon.
- Next LC meeting is May14
- **18. Closing:** A motion was made and seconded to adjourn the Meeting. The motion passed. Ashley Birk closed the meeting with prayer at 3:30 p.m.

General Presbyter Report to Yellowstone's Leadership Cabinet April 9, 2024

I have been pondering that we, like Jesus' followers in scripture, live in a challenging, sometimes fear producing and fast changing culture and context at all levels right now. AND... history has been changed forever with Christ's death and resurrection! So....

How can we be Easter people, Experiencing and Practicing Resurrection, living between Easter and Jesus final coming to reign, living in the *in between*, in the *'already but not yet'*?!

From Julian of Norwich's many chapters of the "shewing" from Jesus: "Jesus said <u>not</u> 'Thou shalt not be tempested, thou shalt not be travailed, thou shalt not be dis-eased;' but he said, 'Thou shalt not be overcome." AS WELL AS :

"I may make all things well, and I can make all things well, and I shall make all things well, and I will make all things well; and you will see for yourself that every kind of thing will be well."

Based on this message she then wrote:, "And in these words God wishes us to be enclosed in rest and in peace." See below from Leonard Sweet's piece on this, April 5 FB.

I like how Eugene Peterson would refer to '**Formation-by-resurrection'** as central to what Christ's people are called to. This stands in contrast to formed by the "world around us" media, governments, ideologies and causes... which seeks to squeeze, remake us in it's own mold, (wording from JB Phillips translation)

<u>~Resurrection love (agape)</u> – personal, unconditional love of Christ, Jonn 13:34,35. Love seen in his passion, with Peter in John 21, beautifully expressed in Rom 8 "we are more than conquerors through Christ who loves us....nothing ...can separate us from the love of God in Christ" not.....!!

The FIRST Great commandment – Love God

<u>~Resurrection energy/power, (*dunamis*</u>) which includes power to heal and authority over evil Jesus' commission to his disciples in gospels, see Acts stories, Eph 3:20,21

~ Resurrection witnesses/storytellers/truth tellers with the Good News -

~Resurrection relationships and community – post resurrection and rest of the NT

~Resurrection hope - is in the midst of the sufferings, siftings, trials, tempering...

Rom 15:13

~Resurrection patterns, practices and perspectives - taught and modeled in Acts ie 2:42 and all the epistles and on into the first centuries, including

apostles' teaching, Word – living and written, handed down

fellowship (*koinonia*) - Centrality of community *in Christ* (our cornerstone, the main thing...)& relationships, versus Amer. individualism

sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper) Table fellowship, house or micro churches **prayer** –

hospitality

love in action for neighbors including care for least, lost, lonely ,left out *By Leonard Sweet*, *April 5 FB*.

The beloved phrase of Julian of Norwich "All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well" appears several times throughout Julian's spiritual classic "Revelations of Divine Love" (1373) with slight variations. Her writings stand as the earliest extant English language works by a woman, The first appearance of this quote is where Jesus speaks to this anchoress and says: "I may make all things well, and I can make all things well, and I shall make all things well, and I will make all things well; and you will see for yourself that every kind of thing will be well." Julian then reflects on this message:, "And in these words God wishes us to be enclosed in rest and in peace."

The abbreviated phrasing "All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well" appears later in the text, in Chapter 31 (or Chapter 15 in some editions).

But what is not often quoted (as I learned from children's book author Anne Booth) is that in these same "Showings" (as these "Revelations" are sometimes known), in chapter 68, there is this "shewing" from Jesus: "Jesus said not 'Thou shalt not be tempested, thou shalt not be travailed, thou shalt not be dis-eased;' but he said, 'Thou shalt not be overcome.'"

These two quotes belong together, and one is best not quoted without the other. Easter people still live in the inbetweenness of Holy Saturday, between Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

Church and leadership Transitions and Pastor Searches -

These changes are complex Based on the What, how this has been handled in the'rollout' without all the tools, materials and figures available yet, it's reception and impacts include – confusion, misunderstanding, fear and anxiety, anger, frustration, distrust with the system and leaders.

There are many similarities to the new CLC in how this is being handled, led and it's impacts.

I have a letter to reassure, equip with current available facts and most up to date materials in the works to send out tomorrow to the presbytery. Collecting the facts and finalizing plans for Yellowstone and PMT has been quite time consuming the last few months and the last 10 days as they released info earlier, before Easter, than had been announced.

<u>Christine Long, BOP will be with us in person now for 2 FULL days</u>. In Bozeman, May 16 9-3 to meet/consult in person with those making appointments. In Dillon, evening May 16 & May 17 – presenting, Q & A and consultations in person. Flies out Saturday

General Assembly – see my March report to Presbytery, Volunteers only are free

Synod – In addition to meeting monthly, the work on the Dubuque CRE cohort requires significant time, and exploring collaborations on equipping or areas of current need or opportunity.
