# **Leadership Cabinet**

May 13, 2025

Yellowstone Presbytery Leadership Cabinet met via Zoom for its scheduled meeting on Tuesday, May 13, 2025, beginning at 1:00 p.m.

1. **Opening**: Moderator Dave Thompson called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. with prayer. A quorum was declared present.

- 2. **Dwelling in the Word**: Several versions of Psalm 23 were read. All agreed that this is the Psalm many of us use when seeking comfort. It feeds us. It assures us that God gives us everything we need then proceeds to list those things. Many recite it in times of fear or need. It gives us beautiful pictures of how God cares for us. The image of the Shepherd is very powerful. When God prepares a table in the presence of our enemies, we should remember that the enemy is sometimes within ourselves, like our own self-doubt, a disease, our hatred of self or others. Regardless, we know that God has us, loves us, and is in control. Dave ended our discussion with prayer.
- 3. **Spirit Sightings & Surprises:** Karolee reported that 4 people under 40 want to become members of the Butte congregation. Two of them will also be Baptized. Caroline celebrated her 25-year marriage and turning the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday worship services in Forsyth over to Danny Pratt. Dave celebrated having over 300 in worship on Sundays, including lots of children. Manhattan is seeing 45 to 50 people in worship each Sunday. Julie's church in the Big Hole held its 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Easter Egg Hunt with 15 children taking part. In addition, the church has had 2 people step out from the pews willing to preach occasionally. Stanford church is talking about renewal and about missing people who have left. They plan to send letters to people inviting them to return and share time with brothers and sisters in faith. They might have a picnic when weather warms up.
- **4. Vision Statement:** Karolee read the Yellowstone Presbytery vision statement.

## 5. Approval of Minutes:

 Action: A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes of the April 8 Leadership Cabinet meeting. The motion passed.

- **6. Approval of Agenda:** Discussion of the Higher Education Fund and a Personnel Subcommittee report were added to the agenda. Members agreed with the additions and approved the agenda by consensus.
- 7. **General Presbyter's Report (Attachment A):** Kathy talked of bringing the holy Spirit in with prayer as we struggle to live the resurrection among all of today's struggles. She wants presbytery to focus more than we have on the global church. We must encourage one another and pray for our Pastoral Ministry Team and the heavy load they are carrying. Please read her complete report.
- 8. **Leadership Retreat (Attachment B):** An invitation will be sent to all presbytery team members within 2 days. The planning team consists of Julie Boksich, Melissa Bell, Jamie Schmeling, Dave Thomson and Kathy Goodrich. The retreat will focus on Sabbath practices.
- **9. Presbytery Meeting Planning:** The flyer for the meeting is out. Guests who will join us are Christine Long of BOP, Sandra Moon from the Foundation, and Candice Sweet, Stated Clerk of the Synod. Members were asked what we want Christine Long to focus on in addition to what is new, the employee benefits package and scholarships for pastors. Members discussed the need to offer zoom for the meeting. We will offer it at this meeting, but if we hold a meeting in some of our smaller churches in the future, we won't be able to offer zoom. Thinking ahead, we hope to have Paul and Lydia Neshangwe at out October meeting.
- 10. Camping & Youth (Attachment C): Male staff is still needed at the camps. Scholarships are available for any youth attending camp. The team discussed whether to accept an offering for the Camp Scholarship Fund. Ric noted that the fund includes quite a bit of money. The team talked about accepting the offering for a camp endowment fund, but there are items that need to be set up before an endowment can be established. Members decided by consensus to accept the May 30 presbytery offering for a "Revamp the Camp" fund that can used for things like building repairs. Ric will set up a line item in the financial report for it.

Dave reported he has 15 tickets for the Youth Triennium event July 28 through August 2. Any high school youth who would like to attend is asked to pay \$300.00. The rest of their expenses are covered. Plans include attending Triennium, participating in a mission project, and doing a bit of sightseeing including a visit to the Louisville Slugger Bat Museum.

**11.Rep/Nom:** The team is meeting and working. They have asked David Bierschwale to serve as Synod Commissioner. He will need some training about both Synod and Yellowstone Presbytery. In October presbytery might discuss ways to seek and train people for leadership roles, including roles on presbytery teams and also discuss possibilities for service (e.g., how can we partner with Center Pole).

- **12. Treasurer's Report:** Ric reported no flags on our financial reports. \$589.00 was received for the Linda Hofer Memorial Fund at Jamie Schmeling's installation in Miles City. Ric is working on our cloud file storage system.
- **13.Stated Clerk Report:** Caroline reported that the corporate report had been filed with the Secretary of State office, and she will work to get the corporate name corrected. She has worked with others to plan the May presbytery meeting and to update the presbytery's Round of Prayer updated for the web page. She is thinking of ways to bring church leaders and perhaps church people in eastern Montana together this summer, but no plans are made yet.
- **14.Old Business:** The Dillon Presbyterian Church was granted a \$2,500 matching technology grant. Jamie did agree to serve on the team that reviews these grant requests but reminded the team that her term on LC expires at the end of this year.

#### **15. New Business:**

- a. There is \$6,246.87 left in the Higher Education Fund.
  - **Action:** A motion was made and seconded to divide the remaining funds as follows: \$3,246.87 to LCM in Bozeman, 2,000 to Rocky Mountain Campus Program, and \$1,000 to the campus program at MSU Billings. The motion passed.

Caroline will compose a letter to send to the three campus programs informing them of the gift and that these are the last funds we have to distribute.

b. Personnel Subcommittee: Jamie reminded members that both she and Ashley will term out and leave the LC at the end of December. This means that they will no longer be able to serve on the Personnel Subcommittee. LC will have to deal with this at a future meeting.

### 16. Concerns and Prayer Requests:

Jamie reported that her beloved pet bunny Thumper has died, and the Schmeling home is very quiet right now.

Pray for all our churches and particularly the Ennis Church and Mary Grace

17. **Closing:** With no further business, Dave Thompson closed the meeting with prayer.

# General Presbytery Report to Leadership Cabinet May 13, 2025 Kathy Goodrich

In this Resurrection season of Jesus' triumph over sin, evil and death, of life, hope, joy, and power

I am praying and pondering the honest struggles and hopes of faith, the transformative power and presence of Jesus, the power of walking with, listening to, being WITH Jesus in community and around table together, the power in listening to and being touched by God -> our hearts were burning within us, disciples with hearts on fire can't help do and go wherever to share the story of their encounter and experience with Jesus with others.

The fellowship of the burning heart – 1. Wesley and the Methodist awakening in England and the US (Steven Foster, Anglican rector in St. Aldates in Oxford where this awakening spread commented that what is being experienced in Oxford and other places in the UK has not been seen in this way since the days of Wesley)

2. A group of Presbyterian young people at a camp for college/young people, almost all Presbyterians in SoCal, Forest Home, had a POWERFUL experience of our Triune God, in Dr. Henrietta Mears cabin as they prayed and described themselves going forward as the Fellowship of the Burning Heart.

#### Luke 24

<sup>21</sup> but we had hoped that he...<sup>25</sup> He[Jesus] said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! <sup>26</sup> Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" <sup>27</sup> And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

<sup>28</sup> As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going farther. <sup>29</sup> But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them.

<sup>30</sup>When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. <sup>31</sup>Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. <sup>32</sup>They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

<sup>33</sup> They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together <sup>34</sup> and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.
