**24-033. Dwelling in the Word:** Presbyters sang "Holy, Holy, Holy" after which Moderator Mary Grace read Romans 8:22-27 followed by a quiet time for meditating and journaling. Presbyters were divided into small groups for discussion. People reported out of small groups that there is a yearning for more personal holiness, for more of God and that it is natural to feel this since we are in God's reign yet not quiet where we need to be yet, that the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness and creates in us a groaning that cannot be calmed with words. We are reminded that we are image bearers of Christ and in order to reflect on God, God must be present. Questions raised included Where does hope come from? How do we find it? Is anger the antithesis of hope or does anger come from unfulfilled hope? The time was concluded with prayer.

**24-034. Omnibus Motion: Attachment A**

5. That Presbytery grant the Moderator authority to give privilege of the floor to persons, other than Members or Commissioners, for the purpose of reporting to this meeting.

6. That the Moderator and the Stated Clerk be empowered to suggest and adjust the agenda during the meeting, as may be necessary.
7. That the minutes of the Presbytery meeting of March 1-2, 2024 be approved as printed on the presbytery meeting website.
8. That the minutes of this meeting shall report that there has been no call for a meeting of the Presbytery's PJC this year to date and that the following former members are still eligible to serve if needed: MWS Dan Krebill, RE Lloyd Mandeville, RE Sharla Helland, RE Gary Slagel, MWS Jody McDevitt and MWS Lanny Rounds.

The motion was seconded, and it passed.

**24-035. Board of Pensions (BOP) Benefits Plans:** Rev. Christine Long, Church Consultant with the Board of Pensions, presented on the new benefits plan that will go into effect January 1, 2025. Pastors may opt to remain in the current plan for the next three years but are encouraged to look at all options before making a decision. Churches are encouraged to call Christine with any questions they have or assistance they may need in choosing the best plan for their pastor situation. The new plan will affect installed pastors, contract pastors, CRE's, those serving in validated ministries and church staff. The new plan offers several options, so each church and pastor are encouraged to calculate what each option will cost the church and the pastor. Some options may offer lower cost to the congregation and some to the pastor.

Churches are encouraged to get death and disability benefits to church employees as both the church and the employees can benefit. A calculator is online to help with calculations.

Christine noted a couple of ways to add to a minister's income or pension that won't impact their effective salary thus keeping pension costs down:

- A church can reimburse a pastor up to ½ of their FICA (Social Security and Medicare) directly to the minister who does not have to report the reimbursement to BOP (called the SECA effect). It does, however, get reported to the I.R.S. as taxable income.
- If a minister contributes to a BOP 409(3)(b) pension, the church can match the pastor's contribution, and the church match is not included in the effective salary.

**24-036. Spirit Sighting:** Marie Hamilton of Dillon began praying for the Dillon Church and offered an opportunity for others to join her. Eighteen people signed up. Texts are sent out for immediate needs and a prayer list is shared weekly. It has grown to two prayer groups and comes to Session monthly as well. She is also organizing an effort for the congregation to support those fostering children, including family members who do so. Thirdly, one church member has parents who are missionaries. They voiced the need for midwives and the Dillon church answered. They now support a midwife for \$3,100. The Spirit is alive and moving people to action in Dillon.

**24-037. Business Meeting:**

- **Pastoral Ministry Team (PMT): Attachment B** The PMT submitted a written report. Two Boundary Training sessions will be offered, one August 3 and a second November 9. Ministers, CRE's and Christian Educators must attend one of the two sessions. Elders will be encouraged to attend. Both sessions are via Zoom. We say goodbye to CRE Chuck Wright who is moving to Tennessee this month. PMT will work on minimum salary guidelines for 2025 beginning in June and call a special meeting of the presbytery to vote on their recommendation when it is complete.

- **Leadership Cabinet (LC): Attachment C** The LC submitted a written report. The LC will grant up to \$6,000 in Higher Education scholarships to campus ministries this year. 2025 will be the last year we have funds for these scholarships. People are asked to consider other ways we can be supportive of our campus ministry programs as the grants are phased out.

JP Carlson spoke about the vibrant campus ministry LCM at MSU Bozeman (Loved. Called. Moved). The ministry has up to 10 denominations represented and includes some international students. Area pastors have visited and spoken to the students. **Treasurer's Report: Attachment D** Ric Tieman reported that both administrative and program budgets are on track for the year.

**Policies mandated by General Assembly:** It was asked when churches might see sample policies on racism, anti-harassment, churches are mandated to have. The Stated Clerk promised that, by summer's end, sample policies will be available for all churches.

**\*Action:** Leadership Cabinet recommends Yellowstone Presbytery form an Administrative Commission composed of Caroline Fleming, Jamie Schmeling and Russ Kline with authority to sell or otherwise dispose of the land in Valley County and report back to presbytery when the disposal is complete.

The motion is necessary because we have an inaccessible piece of land in Valley County that we have not yet been able to dispose of. A church used to sit on the property, but it burned in a prairie fire on September 11, 1971, along with most of the rest of the town of Oswego. The motion passed.

- **General Presbyter's report: Attachment E** The General Presbyter submitted a written report. She recommended two valuable resources: [When the Church Stops Working](#) by Andrew Root, and "Pastoring in a Secular Age" in Presbyterian Outlook. She will send a presbytery-wide email about volunteering at the General Assembly in Salt Lake following the meeting.
- **Camping & Youth Ministry Team: Attachment F** The Camping & Youth Team submitted a written report. Revamp the Camp weekend is May 31-June 2. All are invited to participate. Registration is open for all camp weeks. Register early to receive a discounted registration fee. A cook and nurse are still needed as are male counselors. ## Pastoral Ministry Team Report May 2024

Please pray for our delegates as they participate in the General Assembly decisions.

**Leadership Cabinet** – I have met several times with LC, and worked on a range of things with and for leaders outside of meeting as I seek to fulfill this important role in leadership and visioning amidst changes and challenging times with fewer people. Times dwelling in the Word and sharing Spirit Sightings and Surprises from our lives and across the presbytery are always lifegiving and encouraging. They continue to attend to a very wide range of work on behalf of the whole presbytery including property matters, work on the finances, higher education partnerships,

personnel, policy work for new or updating policies. I work with Ric Tieman as he has needed as our our new website, launched mid April launch. DO check it out.

I work with the Presbytery Planning Team, including the new task force, Uncovering Buried Treasure and Sharing the Light.

**Exploring and learning about Dinner Church and Fresh Expressions of Church** – this continues to be one of the ways established, mainline churches are loving, listening, serving, connecting with, and discipling those who do not attend church in their communities. I and several others are learning and plan to start networking, dreaming together her in Yellowstone. Please talk with Julie Boksich or myself about this.

**PMT –**

**Pastoral Ministry Team – These are extraordinarily busy times for this Team, with co-moderators Neva Rathbun and Debbie Ernst, RE, Bozeman, and members giving generously of their time, energies, wisdom, discernment, care and prayer. Grateful for the presence, wisdom and gifts.**

**Pastor Searches, CLC** – ¼ of the presbytery's congregations are in searches, or may be soon, with PNC's and sessions and PMT liasons/moderators serving sacrificially, along with the work Caroline and I do for/with them. . And that at a time of clergy shortages, fewer going into pastoral ministry, and difficulty retaining pastors.

All of us must continue to educate ourselves about various aspects of the new CLC system, seek help on various aspects, create some materials ourselves as the CLC still does not have all of what is needed for PNC's. We need to continue to seek ways for the system to actually provide some matches for our congregations and find and use "work arounds" of many kinds. This continues to be a time consuming and ongoing concern at every EP gathering in the synod or nationally.

PLEASE put our congregations, our leaders, PMT, and Caroline and myself on your *regular* prayer lists.

And, pray for that we and leaders will recognize and be part of the Spirit calling those gifted for ministry now and in the future.

**Board of Pensions announced their major changes for 2025+.** I have been seeking to stay abreast on these, meeting/coordinating/planning with Christine Long and communicating individually with pastors, PNC, elders, and in writing to the presbytery on this since January. PMT met with her for a training last week. We are all grateful for her great combination of experience and gifts to inform ,consult, advise pastors, staff, and churches through the learning and discerning phases and that she can be with us in person these 2 days.

NOTE: the calculator has just been released. Ric has made it an easily accessible red button on our beautiful NEW website.

I have had conversations and been researching **The Omaha Seminary Foundation's** just released new **Synergos "grant/residency"** has very specific criteria for a few churches in the Synod through their application which could help subsidize a new pastor out of seminary in a church. More to follow.

**Required Boundary Training (every 3 years), will be offered jointly with/for Glacier Presbytery, August 3 & Nov. 9, via zoom. 9-1 pm, with Mark Bassingthwaite, Esq.**

NOTE: this is **now required by our BOO, for EVERY pastor, CRE, AND elder, every 3** Further details including promo ad registration info should be out shortly. Caroline and I have met several times with Janet Potter, COM chair, Glacier.

**Synod** – In addition to meeting monthly with the Staff Forum, the work on the Dubuque CRE cohort requires significant time, along with exploring collaborations (sharing time, money and gifts) on equipping or areas of current need and pursuing opportunity.

I worked with Plains and Peaks Presbytery getting a synod grant so that anyone in our presbytery and synod could **meet virtually with Dr. Andrew Root May 13**. Quite a good group from Yellowstone were part of a helpful and encouraging discussion about the spiritual practices that are foundational to focus on "When Church Stops Working" the title of his latest of many insightful books. I and others would be happy to share insights.

**226<sup>th</sup> General Assembly, meeting in Salt Lake City** – in person June 29-July 4 with worship around the region Sunday and then long plenary meeting days. Committees meet virtually immediately ahead and then travel to Salt Lake. Format is condensed with OGA's decision not to have/invite the range of ministries and groups, seminaries, networks, presentations, or "reunion" gatherings of various sorts which have been a part of these gatherings for many decades. Desire for commissioners to be on the floor except for meals, cost cutting measures, and other reasons have led OGA not to provide for an exhibit hall or gathering space for general visitors, commissioner spouses, Presbyterian groups...
