The Invitation to the Table

Presider 1 (P): Come, looking to the past and remember Christ welcomed sinners to His table

(All) We hear his voice saying, "Today salvation has come to this house"

Presider 1 (P): Come looking to the present and believe Christ is with us

We hear his voice saying, "I am with you always"

Presider 1 (P): Come looking to the future and hope for the coming of God's kingdom

We hear his voice saying, "on earth as it is in heaven"

Presider 2 (L): We look to the past, to the meals Christ shared with people regarded as unworthy and outsiders; We look to the past, to the meals that he shared with the multitude, feeding them with the gifts of the poor:

ALL: We look to the past to the meal that he shared with his disciples on the night he was betrayed.

Presider 1 (P): For I received from the Lord that which I passed on to you: that our Lord Jesus, on the night on which he was betrayed, took bread, gave thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you, Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after the supper, he took the cup and said, "This cup is God's new covenant, sealed with my blood. Drink of it, in memory of me."

Presider 2 (L): We look to the present, to this meal, which, through bread and wine, places Christ's promise in our hands: We look to the present, to this meal which through brokenness, celebrates God's gift of healing:

ALL: We look to the present, to this meal, where we proclaim Christ's death until he comes.

Presider 1 (P): We look to the future, in faith, because by emptying himself, Christ forgives and reconciles, We look to the future, in hope, because by his resurrection, Christ makes all things new.

ALL: We look to the future, in love, because by his Spirit, we are sent to share abundant life for all.

Prayer by Presider 1 (P):

In love you sent your word and wisdom, Jesus Christ, to speak your word of healing and inspire a vision of a reconciled world; to show a wisdom that makes us one and breaks down the barriers that divide us. In love you took bread and wine as signs of forgiveness and generosity. Following your example, we take bread and wine and ask for your Spirit, that they may become for us signs of your body and blood. Amen.

Presider 2 (L): We receive this bread, gift of God for all God's people, we break it, at one with the world's brokenness, and to affirm that we are many,

ALL: Yet in this one loaf we are united and through its sharing we are healed.

(The bread is broken and all eat together)

Presider 1 (P): We receive this wine, gift of God for all God's people,

we pour it out, at one with all who wound and are wounded ALL: Yet in this cup we are cleansed and through its sharing we are made whole.

(Wine is poured and all drink together)

Presider 1(P): Lord Jesus, thank you for nourishing us with the bread of life and the cup of salvation.

ALL: That we may nourish and heal your broken world. **AMEN.**
