-Scholarship Fund Raising:

We offered \$1,003 in scholarships from the Yellowstone Presbytery Scholarship Fund in 2011. This fund has been depleted. Curt received a phone call from First Presbyterian Church Billings indicating that they will be sending a check to support Westminster Spires in the amount of \$500 as a part of their mission program. These funds will be deposited into the Scholarship Fund.

-Curriculum: We have ordered a copy of the new camp curriculum from Chalice Press for 2012. This is titled <u>Secrets of the Kingdom The Parables of Jesus</u>. I have attached a brief overview of the daily "Discoveries".

-PCCCA Membership: We have renewed our membership in PCCCA for 2012. (\$275)

Additional Camps

-George and Curt will plan a College Weekend for July 27-29. This will be on the weekend following the end of Senior High Camp.

Well-water supply status

Chuck Beck has been working closely with the engineering firm and contractors to complete the connection of the new well to the water supply system. At this point, the best estimate of remaining cost is as follows:

- -Remaining Costs- \$17,586
- -Funds Available \$14,751
- -Short- \$2,835

It appears that weather (snow in Red Lodge area) may require the work to be completed in the spring. As we determine a more specific amount of remaining costs, we will request Council to consider allocating funds from the Program Budget General Mission Fund. At this point we anticipate this request to be not more than \$3,000.

UPDATE 1/17/12- Most of the work on the well connection to the water supply system has been completed. Many thanks to Chuck Beck for taking leadership of this project and the good weather in November and December! A gift of \$3,000 was made in early January to help cover the costs of this project. Remaining costs are expected to be minimal.

General Notes

As we have noted several times in the past, our Youth Retreats and Summer Camp Program at Westminster Spires would not be possible if we did not have generous volunteer support and leadership of people from throughout Yellowstone Presbytery. If you know anyone that would be interested in serving as a part of the leadership for retreats or camps for any period of time, please contact Curt Kochner or George Goodrich. We will be hiring college students as counselors and a few high school students as Counselors-in-Training. Let us know if you know people that would be interested in any of the camp staff positions.

Westminster Spires operates on a minimal budget. At this point our primary financial needs are in the areas of facilities and camp scholarships. We expect that we will need approximately \$3,000 to complete the installation and connection of the water supply system to the new well. Our refrigerator is ancient, and when it finally gives out, we expect replacement costs to be around \$3,000. The camp is on leased Forest Service land, and we are experiencing significant loss of large trees to beetle infestation. Although we can utilize volunteer labor to clear smaller trees and brush, we will need to hire professionals at some point to cut down the larger trees that are near buildings and power lines.

Curriculum themes for 2012

Jesus Is in the "Least of These"

Campers hear the parable of the sheep and the goats and will consider ways we can open our eyes to the needs of the world and respond to them with compassion and generosity.

Discovery 6- Matthew 13: 31-35

God Plants Us in the World

Campers hear the parables of the mustard seed and the yeast and learn that God can use our smallest acts to grow the kingdom.
