Mission Funding Grant Request Presby Cats Spring Break Mission Trip March 9-15, 2014

First Presbyterian Church in Bozeman is privileged to host, and I'm privileged to work directly with, the Presbytery of Yellowstone's outreach to students at Montana State University called Presby Cats. The Presby Cats ministry, which began in August 2012, has enjoyed success from the beginning. After the initial success of our first year in which 15 students participated, the ministry this year has grown to a group of 22 students on our current active list. From among this group, we have 12-14 attending each Sunday for our luncheon and Bible study after worship. In addition to our weekly Sunday gatherings, we also had a fall retreat with a winter retreat coming up at the end of January. A variety of social events are also on the calendar.

There are 9 students who have committed to participate in our spring break mission trip to Ghost Ranch in New Mexico, an education and retreat center of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Of these 9, 6 are from Montana (Anaconda, Billings, Bozeman, Harlem, and Turner), 1 is from Idaho Falls, ID, and 1 is an international student from Kyrgyzstan. I am the adult leader of the group. The total cost of this trip is \$11,400. The participants and their home churches are chipping in roughly 1/3 of this, with another 1/3 from fund raising. With this document I am requesting that the Presbytery of Yellowstone provide a mission funding grant in the amount of \$3,650 as the final 1/3. Appended to this grant request are the summary page regarding this mission trip along with the budget for this trip.

Because the bulk of the costs of this trip are due by 30 days before the mission trip, a decision on this request before that time would be most helpful. Any such grant made can be made payable to First Presbyterian Church in Bozeman.

What is required –

- a completed application form
- your willingness to commit to expectations outlined on application form
- \$100 down payment by December 5, 2013; \$375 total (scholarships available)
- your energy and creativity for raising funds (total cost per person is approximately \$1,250)
- your willingness to learn about mission and service and prepare to be an ambassador for Christ and his church

Travel details -

We will leave Bozeman on Sunday evening, March 9, to drive to Billings where we'll spend the night in order to catch a 6:00 a.m. flight on Monday, March 10, to Albuquerque, NM, by way of Denver. We'll drive 130 miles to Ghost Ranch, arriving there early afternoon. Room and board will be at Ghost Ranch through Saturday, March 15, when we will drive back to Albuquerque for our return flight arriving in Bozeman around 9:15 p.m.
