# School year 2009-2010 Program Goals and Assessment

The 2009-1010 academic year was a year of transition in that our volunteer campus ministry coordinator completed his service in May after having served from the time that the United Methodist Presbyterian Campus Ministry ended concurrent with the ending of financial support by the Yellowstone Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. The session then undertook the process of determining how best to proceed with funds that were not sufficient to support a campus ministry staff person. This led to the idea of moving away from a traditional staff-based campus ministry program and toward a peer leader program in which qualified Presbyterian MSU students would be offered scholarships of \$500-\$800 per semester with the expectation that the peer leader scholars would become involved in the life and ministry of First Presbyterian Church (FPC). The nature of their involvement would depend on their individual interests and gifts. Through their participation in the life of the church, the hope and expectation is that other MSU students would become involved in the ministry of FPC. The session approved this program and began promoting these scholarships in the spring. By the end of the spring semester, 2 peer leader scholars were selected to begin their involvement in the Fall semester of 2010.

It should be noted that with the launch of this non-traditional campus ministry/outreach program, there is no planned use of the Christus Collegium (Center for Campus Ministry) in the near term or long term. Consequently, there is no objection to proceeding with the withdrawal of the remaining PCUSA interest in that facility.

## School Year 2010-2011 Program Goals

- 1. Work with our initial 2 MSU Peer Leader Scholars to identify meaningful involvement in the life and ministry of First Presbyterian Church (FPC) that benefits the students' Christian faith and enriches the congregation.
- 2. Develop outreach strategies for drawing in additional MSU students into the life and ministry of FPC with an eye toward recruiting additional MSU Peer Leader Scholars as funds are available.
- 3. With insights gained through the first 2 semesters of this new Peer Leader Scholars program, make changes and adjustments in the program to maximize the benefits of this program (for both students and congregation) going forward into the 2011-2012 academic year and beyond.
