Proposal for a Yellowstone Presbytery and Churches Day of Prayer and Fasting

The Presbytery Prayer Cluster would like to propose that the Leadership Cabinet call a day of Repentance, Prayer and Fasting on Tuesday, October 20, 2020 for our nation and for Christ's Church in the world.

Why a Call to Prayer:

- 1. We sense the nation and the world are troubled now and the Prophet Joel (Joel 2: 12-27), (and other prophets) indicate that God may and should be petitioned by the people of God to purify us and to graciously deliver nations and God's people from trouble and affliction.
- 2. The nation and the Church are experiencing racial, ideological, economic and spiritual divisions and conflict.
- 3. The creation is groaning (Romans 8:18-23) fires, hurricanes, rising seas and Covid-19 indicate a change in climate patterns that are effecting and will have an effect on the world now and for coming generations.

So we propose the following that...

A day of prayer and fasting be scheduled in Yellowstone Presbytery for...

- a. ...God to mercifully intervene and provide for honest, trustworthy elections.
- b. ...relief from and cessation of Covid-19 and other natural disasters from ravaging the country and the world.
- c. ...for all those hurting and under- and un-employed in this economy.
- d. ...all candidates running for office to be honorable persons of integrity and for the government to function "of the people, by the people, and for the people" (Abraham Lincoln, Gettysburg Address, 1863 "one nation under God, with liberty and justice for all" (Pledge of Allegiance).
- e. ... the Church to be renewed in the Holy Spirit and to rise up in the authority of Christ with a prophetic voice in word, deed and love for justice and evangelism, concern for the poor, and to be concerned for all in body and soul.
- f. ...reaffirming of our Hope and Peace in Christ, who will be exalted among the nations, who will be exalted in the earth; who is with us and our fortress (Psalm 46:10-12).
