

# News from Presbyterian Women Presbytery of Yellowstone January 2016



## Minneapolis, MN June 18-21

Joining 1,700 other women (and a few men) Yellowstone Presbytery PW Moderator Merry Lee Hooks from Madison Valley, TE Teresa Kendall from Deer Lodge, TE Susi Ennis from Poplar, and Donna Beck, Suzanne Bratsky, Sally Broughton & Susan Gibb from Bozeman attended the recent celebration in Minneapolis. Using 1 Corinthians 12:12-27 and the theme "One Body, One Spirit," we enjoyed four plenary & worship sessions with fantastic music, numerous educational workshops, five on-site mission tours, a March for Justice & Peace, a Silent Witness against discrimination and a Gathering-wide communion service. Several women from our Mission Partners around the world provided colorful accents with their beautiful native dress.

Over \$30,000 in Target gift cards were donated in support of the Minneapolis-area American Indian Family Center and over \$32,000 collected in the Gathering Offering for a women's vocational institute in Puerto Rico.

The Activities Hall provided opportunities to visit the Presbyterian Bookstore, Speakers' Corner and Global Marketplace. The several workshops were very informative and wideranging from mission experiences and opportunities, leadership programs, ending violence against women, global food security, upcoming *Horizons* Bible Studies, Native American rights, to Presbyterian Women organization.

During the business meeting conducted before the Gathering our own Wanda Beauman from Synod of the Rocky Mountains was elected as the new Churchwide vice-moderator for justice and peace concerns.

I say it is our turn because this June we will show our "know how" at The PW Gathering of the Synod of the Rocky Mountains in Cheyenne, Wyoming. The theme will be about challenges facing all rural churches. (exact dates next week)

The 2015 September/ October "Horizons" has an excellent article titled "Presbyterian Women Astride the Divide" by Sarah Kennerly. "The PW Purpose is the mission statement for the organization. If you are committed to what the purpose envisions, why should you disclaim the statement as an individual simply because your church leaves the PC( USA)? You can continue Presbyterian Women's work individually or with one of PW's many secular or faith-based partners." After all is said and done "Since 1888 Presbyterian Women have joyfully expressed gratitude for God's blessings by sharing their blessings with those in need at home as well as around the world."

PW of the Yellowstone holds the Thank Offering Celebration in the fall. This offering helps fund projects in our communities or in the world and comes through the Creative Ministries Offering Committee of Presbyterian Women. The goal for this year's giving is \$900,000. PW of the Yellowstone Presbytery typically gives \$700 towards this effort. Look for the Thank Offering Poster on the PW bulletin board in your church.


We are looking forward to the Presbyterian Women's USA mission experience to visit Cameron House while in the San Francisco Bay Area in September 2016. "Out of darkness.... into the Light" ( John 1:5) We will save money to send delegates from the Synod to understand the challenges faced by women and children in that area. Participants will focus on immigration, human trafficking, domestic violence and related issues and be available to speak at PW events. Last year the international mission experience took place in Haiti and if all goes well Theresa Varnado, synod delegate to Haiti, will visit to tell us about her experience for the PW Spring Gathering in 2016.

This quote, from Kathleen Norris, "Joy has always been an important part of my life, but it wasn't until I became a Benedictine oblate (an associate member of a monastery) that I appreciated its place in my spiritual life," she said. "I was muttering to one of the monks about my lack of spiritual discipline and my haphazard prayer life, when he said to me, 'I don't worry about you at all. You have joy, and that is one of the traditional fruits of the Holy Spirit.` This was news to me, and it cheered me immensely, reminding me that even when I wasn't 'doing' the stuff I felt I should be doing, the Spirit was working in me nonetheless."

I've got some exciting opportunities to add to your calendars this year. Presbyterian Women in the Synod is sponsoring a Disaster Preparedness Training session in Cheyenne, WY, June 10, in conjunction with our triennial synod gathering. You do not have to be active in Presbyterian Women, but we do invite you to stay for the PW triennial gathering on June 11-12. 
A short business meeting followed. Ideas for selling different items at our next Christmas Bazaar table, a successful Blood Drive, and prayers for church members and friends were discussed.


### PW NEWS FROM BOZEMAN

We are excited in Bozeman for the formation of a new circle called the Lydia Circle. Last year there was talk of forming a new circle with a different meeting time and this fall it has happened. We planned a "kick off" event in the early fall with a served dinner and then The Rev. Carol Shellenberger lead us in an overview of the Horizon's Bible Study, "Come to the Waters 2015-1216." Carol's emphasis was that anyone can lead a lesson in the Horizon's Bible Study. Bonnie Blakely gave a program on making Feminine Hygiene Kits. These kits can be used by a variety of women in all parts of the world including in our state. She is setting up a chapter for Days for Girls (Daysforgirls.org) here in Montana. Because the prices of feminine products are so great, she is hoping to make the kits available to the homeless, prisoners and others who need this sort of help. "Days for Girls" name comes from the fact that in Africa, the girls have to stay home from school during their cycle because they have no feminine hygiene products.
