- 5. That the Moderator and the Stated Clerk be empowered to make adjustments to the Agenda during the meeting, as may be necessary, to provide for efficiency in reporting, and
- 6. That all reports received at this meeting be accepted and if not supplied to the presbytery office in advance an electronic copy shall supplied to the office of the stated clerk and the presbytery office immediately following the meeting.

19-005. RE Julie Boksick led the presbytery in Dwelling in the Word, Luke 9 vs 9-27. The focus of the meeting was "Equipping and Encouraging". Part 1: Following the Leader – Jesus. What did Jesus do? What did the disciples do? The passages in Luke 9 and later 10 helped develop a biblical understanding of our role as disciples and underlined all the discussions for the meeting.

19-006. A skit was performed to emphasize the use of storytelling and demonstrated modeling behavior.

19-007. Rob Hagan from the Presbyterian Foundation gave a brief summary talk about the training offered to some of the gathering at the preconference event on how to do effective stewardship and the help available through the foundation.

19-008. Equipping and Encouraging Part 2: Following the Leader – Jesus. What do we do? Practices/Habits, Priorities, Patterns.

19-009. Rev Teresa Kendall moderator of the leadership cabinet presented a first reading for nominees to serve on the REP/NOM committee and its moderator position. Her report included a request for the attendees to turn in a critique form for the meeting and asked for everyone to respond. She indicated the LC was monitoring the progress of the church's adoption of a Child and Youth Protection Policy and that they need to complete the process of getting a policy in place as soon as possible.

19-011. RE Curt Kochner gave a report on the camping and youth summer camp plans and made applications available for church representatives to take back to their churches. A cook is needed and Cynthia Kessler is resigning and her replacement as a craft director is needed. Cynthia was recognized and the thanks of the body was expressed for her long service at the camp.

19-012. Rev. Dave Thompson gave a written report for the PMT (**Exhibit B**). Special Recognition was given to Pricilla Bell for her long time service in the presbytery. Members spoke many praises for her dedicated service to the church.

It Was voted > to Honorably Retire Pricilla Bell from active service to the presbytery as an At Large Member to the role of retired members.

Dave presented a motion to allow a onetime extension beyond the 6-year term limit for a ruling elder to serve on the session of the Anaconda church.

It was voted > to waive the term of office limitation and allow the one time one term extension for the RE at Anaconda to serve on the session.

19-013. RE Caroline Fleming presented a report of the REP/NOM committee to fill 2 vacancies on the camping and youth committee which were created by the departures of Katie Emery and Susan Barnes.

A first reading of the appointees to be elected was held. RE Missey Turner from Butte and TE Daniel Triller from Dillon were nominated.

19-014. The meeting recessed for dinner and worship at 6:00 PM.

During the evening worship RE Russ Kline was installed as Vice Moderator and Rev. Susi Ennis was installed as Moderator. The charge and professions were administered by outgoing moderator CRE Jack Bell and concluded with prayer and laying on of hands.

The offering received totaling \$852.00, will go to Westminster Spires Camp Scholarship Fund.

19-015. The meeting reconvened at 8:10 AM Saturday with an opening prayer and dwelling in the word led by RE Curt Kochner. The camping and youth committee report was part of the meeting package and is attached as (**Exhibit C.**)

The scripture reading was Luke 10 vs 1-12. After the word-share-prayer session, Curt led a discussion with George Goodrich, Hunter Skol, and Kristen Kochner on the impact of camping and church related activity how it affected

them. The talk was on "Growing Young, 6 Essential Strategies to Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church."

- 1. Unlock Keychain Leadership. Keychain leaders equip and empower.
- 2. Empathize with Today's Young People. Small groups essential.
- 3. Take Jesus' Message Seriously. Help find ways to pursue the way to follow together.

The statistical report for year ending 2018 was presented (**Exhibit H.**) and special note made regarding the purging of roles by 3 of the churches and the low amount of mission giving vs. a surplus in giving over expenses. It was also noted a high number of friends of congregations are actively participating but not joining our fellowships. The report was approved and accepted.

March 2019

The Vision Statement of our presbytery is the framework for our report this time. Please note the 2019 goals from our Leadership Cabinet following its evaluation of 2017-18's:

I. Yellowstone Presbytery – guided and sustained by scripture, the Holy Spirit, and prayer—is a community rooted in the love of Christ:

These are times of rapid change which can be confusing and unsettling times for many of us, for the people Christ calls us to shepherd and for the people and communities where God sends us to proclaim and embody the Good News. Nationally and globally, developments on the political scene are unsettling for many. Culturally, the calls for setting things right by addressing racism, sexism, and immigration rightly capture the conscience and passion of the church. Events in the Roman Catholic Church, Southern Baptist Convention, United Methodist Church, in the Willow Creek Church, to name a few, are sadly eroding public and attender confidence in all churches. Worship attendance nationally is in steady decline. The pastor shortage across the larger Church continues. Yet, the spiritual, relational, social, justice hungers continue, as God's opportunities for the body of Christ, us as Christ's disciples.

Where do we find our new patterns, power and basis of response to these challenges and calls?

We, as Presbyterians, have pledged, with the Church in every age, to be "guided and sustained by Scripture, the Holy Spirit, and Prayer..." The Directory for Worship is instructive for our reliance on Scripture (W-2.2001): "The Church confesses the Scriptures to be the Word of God written, witnessing to God's self-revelation. Where that Word is read and proclaimed, Jesus Christ the Living Word is present by the inward witness of the Holy Spirit...." The Holy Spirit brings God's voice through scripture present in our context and helps us rightly apply and be guided by the scriptures today. BUT- The Holy Spirit mainly does so through prayer, the spiritual practices/disciplines and disciple communities. When we are humble and patient and prayerful, the Holy Spirit can help us discern the way forward together, as Christ's twenty-first century disciples. Believing this, we have life, Christ's life, as Yellowstone Presbytery – and as individual congregations.

II. We Will Gather Together... "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging each other and all the more as you see the day drawing near." Hebrews 10:24-25. In all of our God-loving, Christ-following diversity, we are the body of Christ and the better for meeting together. The opportunities to gather with each other in Christ are regular and intentional:

- <u>A.</u> Three presbytery meetings a year... at which we worship; we dwell in the Scripture in such a way that we believe that Christ is actually, spiritually present; we fellowship with, pray for and encourage one another in faith and life. At presbytery, as we are in our Churches, Sunday to Sunday and in groups and 1-1 throughout the week, we are the body of Christ gathered for God, for each other and for the sake of Christ and Christ's mission in the world God loves. We also:
 - a. Meet monthly as clusters of pastors and lay leaders... Butte (Veva Larson), Central (Debbie Funke), Billings (Dave Thompson), and Miles City (Neva Rathbun).
 - b. Convene as the open-to-any preaching cohort before presbytery meetings (Jack Bell or Susi Ennis).
 - c. Work, study, pray and attend to various teams, ministries and missions of our presbytery PMT, LC, Camping and Youth...
 - d. Pray for each other in the presbytery's round of prayer, posted on the Yellowstone Presbytery website: yellowstonepcusa.org.
- III. We Will Equip and Encourage disciple-making congregations and leaders for living the Gospel... intentionally becoming more like Christ, ably sharing our faith; impacting leaders.

We equip and encourage each other at presbytery meetings through:

- a. <u>Resourcing modules</u>: This presbytery meeting we are providing resources and encouragement for pastors and leaders to obey Christ's command/invitation: "Follow Me." Recent meeting resource topics include: (Kathy list...)
- b. <u>Denominational Concerns and Policies</u>: Helping churches and pastors interpret and appropriately implement the guidance and prescribed policies of the PCUSA. In this year, the Children and Youth Protection Policy.
- c. <u>Sharing in the meeting by several congregations</u> what is happening and what God is doing in their corporate life and mission...
- d. Refining our opinions (our perceptions of what God is doing) through dialogue on issues, overtures, etc.
- e. Resourcing between meetings...
 - A. Kathy and I are available to equip and encourage leaders in congregations to better learn, explore and practice some of the works of ministry and service,
 - 1. _including visioning and adapting to be missionary, missional communities of disciples in the 21st century, preaching, lay pastoral care, etc. as we are doing in Jordan and elsewhere.
 - 2. Moderating sessions and serving communion in pastor less churches.
 - 3. As we travel through the presbytery, preaching and pastoring, guiding, listening, dreaming with you we are aware that we are the face of the Presbytery, expressing the care and nurture of the presbytery for its churches.
 - **B. Other leaders across our presbytery** with a wide range of spiritual gifts, experiences, passions...
 - <u>C. Jim Tarr, Stated Clerk</u>, is helping our congregations remain in compliance with denominational procedures. This will be a year of transition as Jim, working with Debbie Blackburn and George helps transition Assistant Stated Clerk Melissa Perrault into the Stated Clerk roll. Clerk Report Nov -2018 to March-2019

Nov 2- 3, 2018 attended Presbytery meeting in Bozeman MT. This was my second stated meeting and I thought I was better prepared, however the volunteers who were to work the registration did not get on the registration desk until just before the meeting opening time and as a result the process did not go smooth for the delegates. The short notice cancellation of the Mark Fry Pension pre meeting seminar also caused some issues and adjustments to the registration process.

On Nov 8, 2018 the PMT Met in Billings and Bozeman via conference call and minutes were prepared. The PMT is working on getting more involvement between the liaisons and their assigned churches. A second effort is helping churches without pastors get help with the PNC function. It appeared 5 churches will be without an installed pastor at the end of 2018. RE Margee Smith of Lewistown is moving forward to being commissioned as a CRE under the guidance of the PMT. Prayers for her and her learning to have a positive outcome are in order.

A letter with instructions was sent to the membership regarding the need for each church to comply with the Book of Order provision requiring them to establish a child and youth protection policy. The clerk prepared a draft of a policy a church can use to easily adopt the required policy along with a form to be returned to the presbytery office as to when this policy will be adopted. This work of the churches is being closely monitored by the office of the presbytery and the Stated Clerk to help insure all our youth are provided protection from abuse as they participate in church activities. At this report time only 2 of our 23 churches have developed a session approved policy so we have a long way to go.

On Dec 13, 2018 the LC met in Bozeman and minutes were prepared. Planning for next year's presbytery meetings began and a focus on equipping disciples was planned.

Work of the Clerk in December includes getting the instruction letter out to the church clerks and pastors with the invoices for the per capita billing being mailed. The clerks and pastors also received several emails regarding reports we need to have to be able to remember our elders who have passed on to be with God. The reporting functions get to be a lot of work since we always have some turnover in church clerks and pastors who need to be trained in the process. Between January and February almost every day a communication related to the reporting process needed to be addressed.

The PMT met in Bozeman January 10, 2019 and minutes of the meeting were prepared. New committee members were introduced and briefed on the work of the PMT. The liaison list was reviewed and updated to make the change in membership fit the church assignments.

The LC met January 15, 2019 in Billings and a few members called in to the meeting due to weather conditions. This was the meeting the cabinet looks forward to activities in 2019 and found volunteers to plan for the upcoming meetings. One focus was on "How did Jesus change the culture, habits, and mind set of the church in His time". "How did He do it?" It will be interesting to see if anything happens to alter the course of our churches are taking as we work and study together. The cabinet did a review of the 2018 goals and how they were or were not met and began the process of setting goals for 2019.

The personnel committee met with me via phone call Feb 8 and reviewed job related issues that have needed attention since I began as clerk in April 2018. I appreciate to work of this committee to help staff with issues that affect our work for the presbytery. This is a long overdue function and I appreciate the Cabinet having set up this function and review process. Since I have not completed a year cycle in this position.

I attended by phone a special meeting of the PJC on February 12 at 7:30 PM. The PJC elected rev MWS Jody McDevitt to moderate the commission. RE John Patterson was elected temporary secretary. The clerk was called upon to help organize the newly elected membership and assure leadership was decided. The PJC will report on the discipline section of the BoO overtures we will vote on at the March meeting.

I had a staff meeting in Bozeman On February 22nd to update the status of our records and get materials prepared for the March Meeting. I find it essential to visit the presbytery office once in a while to complete filings and work with staff to get things done that cannot be done via mail or phone calls.

The PMT met March 14 2019 and minutes were taken. The clerk reported to the PMT that session clerk documents have not been reviewed for some time and a provision to get them reviewed will be needed.

The Clerk attended a meeting of Stated Clerks of the Synod on March 19 in Denver for review of our minutes of the meetings of the presbytery in 2018. Our document review was done by Mark Kernning acting stated clerk of the Plains and Peaks Presbytery. He and the review indicated we were missing a few actions and these included:

- 1. We are not recording a review of session minutes and approving them. Most of the presbyteries present require the session clerks to attend one of the presbytery meetings closest to them annually and bring the records to the stated clerk for review. Some make this a training meeting time after the regular meeting time or before and help the clerks understand what has been updated and what is needed in the recording process. Our administrative rules will need amending before this can be a policy.
- 2. The financial books of the presbytery need an annual independent financial review and this has not been done and recorded as having been accomplished. Suggestions for correction were made and selection of a financial document and process review resulted in several options. Responsibility to get this work completed may fall within our leadership cabinet to arrange.
- 3. The PJC membership list needed to be recorded as to current and past members still active with the presbytery at least once per year. The reason for tracking names of past members is so if needed they can be called to review cases both pending and continuing as or as a resource for a current case. We have in our directory the current names and contact information for our PJC but have not listed past members who can be called upon to assist.
- 4. Our Nominating Committee and the Committee on Representation which is a separate required function in the Book of Order are not shown as reporting to the presbytery in the documents. This could be because we have combined the functions due to our size and resources available. It appears we need to work on a modification to our administrative rules and/or our standing rules to define the nature of these separate functions so that their actions can be recorded in our minutes.

My report for the March meeting will include an update of the presbytery status on the following items:

- A. Change in the membership number as a part of our annual statistical report.
- B. A comment on the % of worshipers classed as friends and a total number comparison.
- C. % of mission giving vs % of staff cost.
- D. The PCUSA per capita invoice dated Oct 31, 2018 in the amount of \$13,170.00 was sent to the treasurer for payment.
- E. A letter from Abington Presbytery was received and indicated that MWS Paul Cannon will remain an at large member of Yellowstone Presbytery.
- F. A letter of thanks for financial support in amount of \$1,000.00 was received from Intermountain.
- G. A letter from the Mid Kentucky Presbytery accepting MWS Susan Barnes into their membership was received on Jan 15, 2019.
- H. A letter from Utah Presbytery requesting transfer of membership of Steve Weber to the Utah Presbytery. This requires our previous approval to the Kendall Idaho presbytery be modified to move Steve to the Utah Presbytery instead.
- I. We need to accept the reports of the administrative commissions who met in 2018 and dismiss those whose work is completed. This includes the commission to ordain and install Garret Mostowski at FPC Miles City, MT and to install Daniel Triller at the FPC of Dillon, MT. These commissions need to be dismissed with the thanks of the presbytery for their work. The work of the Geyser administrative committee is to be reported as ongoing.

March 8-9, 2019 Presbytery Meeting

Our report has several attachments, which serve to supplement this narrative. The attachments are the various year end reports prepared by our Treasurer, Sheryl Hallin, as well as a spreadsheet analyzing the status of our reserve funds.

The Leadership Cabinet is pleased to once again report the positive results on these financial statements for 2018. The budget for the Administrative portion of our operations called for transfers from reserve funds of over \$45,000, yet due to generous contributions to the administrative support account as well as conservative spending throughout the year, we only required reserve transfers of a third of the budgeted amount. In addition the Program side of operations only required reserve transfers of one-tenth of the amount originally budgeted. This was primarily a result of generous mission giving from our congregations and larger than expected camp rentals and donations.

You may recall that the 2019 budget passed by this Presbytery at our November meeting anticipates transfers from reserves totaling some \$54,000 on the Administrative side and \$9,000 for Program activity. To keep you informed of the status of these reserves we have attached a spreadsheet outlining this activity. These reserves are crucial to our continued existence in our current form. The Leadership Cabinet continues to monitor this and explores ways to extend the life of this body we all love.

We thank our congregations as well as individuals within our boundaries and beyond for their generous support. We are blessed by God's good grace to be able to continue our vital ministry in this Yellowstone country we all call home.

St. Timothy's Memorial Chapel Committee (STMCC) Report to Yellowstone Presbytery March – 2019

Information -

2018 Summer Worship – We had a total of 446 worshipers in attendance at our 13 worship services. This is a minimal increase over those present in 2016. However, the Offering was \$5,350 - a 20% increase over 2016.

Columbarium – Plans are to develop a brochure on the columbarium for distribution and to place that brochure on our web site.

Chapel Roof – The Chapel was reroofed in September.

2019 Pastors - For years we have

Rev. Andrew Mullins – All of June.

Rev. Dr. Paul Hayden, All of July and August.

Music Concerts – Five Music Concerts are scheduled for 2019.

Weddings – Seven weddings are currently scheduled for 2019.

2019 Maintenance Projects – Next spring we are faced with a number of maintenance projects. While many are small we need to replace the pump for the well at a cost of near \$9,000. Estimated costs for all projects are included in the budget adopted by the committee.

Action items -

1. The St. Timothy's Memorial Chapel Committee requests that the presbytery rescind the St. Timothy's Financial Procedures document.

When the revised document was approved by the presbytery in May of 2018 I commented that the Management Group, after a year or two of experience may bring a recommendation to Presbytery to rescind the document.

Stated clerk report March 2019 to June 2019.

Stated Clerk attended ststed meeting of the Presbytery March 29, 30 2019 in Billings and took minutes of meeting. During the month of April those minutes were perfected with the help of the LC Moderator and The Assistant Stated Clerk. These minutes are ready for adoption at the June 8, 2019 conference call meeting of the presbytery.

Reports on minister transactions and changes made over the past year were finalized and reported to the office of the GA.

Attended meeting of Leadership Cabinet in Bozeman April 9, 2019 and took minutes of meeting.

I participated in a staff training session with George and Melissa on April 10, 2019 and we discussed process for transferring duties and responsibilities of the clerk office to be shared in the next few months and to make recommendations to the personnel committee on changes we proposed to make.

Stated clerk attended a meeting of the PMT on May 9, 2019 and took minutes and reviewed the PMT task list. Thanks to George Goodrich for taking task list notes.

Met with the Assistant Stated Clerk in Billings May 13, 2019 for a couple hours and we reviewed our job sharing duties and how in the next few months work will be performed. The ultimate goal is for Melissa to be elected Stated Clerk at the November meeting of the Presbytery in Lewistown and for the current Stated Clerk to resign and move to be an assistant until the end of the year. This plan was accepted by the LC at its meeting the following day.

Attended the Leadership Cabinet Meeting on May 14, 2019 and took notes of meeting for review after the assistant clerk completes the minutes and task listing.

The At Large out of bounds members were sent a letter for them to consider options regarding their status at the direction of the PMT.

Other work of the office was to report the votes of the presbytery to the GA on the overtures to make several changes to the Book of Order. The Yellowstone Presbytery was in agreement with the final voting in all but items B1 and B2 of the overture package presented at the March meeting.

Four of our 23 churches now have active MIF's reported to the CLC and are actively seeking pastors. The Clerk assists those churches as needed and validates them as required of the PMT.

Preparation of the docket and filing reports for the presbytery meeting in June are tasks worked on prior to this meeting.

*Preaching ("Talking Longer") *Programs ("Old Tricks") *Pastoral Care ("Trying harder")

We start with a regional perspective first this month, reporting from important time with Rocky Mountain Synod Staff Forum, in Denver:

A. Trends across the Synod of the Rocky Mountains. What may God be saying in all of this?

- a. Clergy shortage is here for small, rural & smaller town churches in our region & across the nation. Other synod presbyteries are in it, too.
 - 3 presbyteries committed to further conversation and exploration as to ways we can proactively collaborate such as interpret, recruit, explore a rural internship for seminarians, ...all ideas welcomed. Let's make time to explore this.
- b. The pace of change and technology is impacting all of our churches and ministry **How?**We need to discuss and be learning/teaching ongoing adaption as the NEW NORMAL
- c. Essential to explore new ways/model of equipping, pastoring church in rural areas, small towns and cities, including:
 - i. Equipping, empowering lay people:
 - to discover, develop and use their spiritual gifts, including additional training for some in areas to cover much of what a pastor would do,
 - <u>- creating a ministry team/teams</u> for a congregation or cluster of congregations, especially those with no pastor, but goal is for ALL congregations
 - churches "discover their resources in God/faith, selves, church, community, and ..."
 - ii. Dinner Church / "small discipleship communities," as part of existing congregations, instead of stereotypical, institutional/building/program focused "church." <u>Addressing spiritual hunger, loneliness, identity and purpose</u>
 - d. Presbytery meetings:

- i. Need ways for times of listening, asking and conversation for input on the topic of "Imagining the future of the rural church."
 - ii. Times for educating and empowering lay leaders as well as. How do we spark saving change in rock-ribbed, determined congregations. See iii.
 - iii. See ways to address the need in bold below. A resource to watch and discuss ourselves and consider ways to share broadly- Tod Bolsinger's videos, Canoeing the Mountains, and accompanying book of presentation to Philadelphia Presbytery & that ELCA Synod. See section II G below for info & links

B.Yellowstone Presbytery, synopsis we shared of goals and challenges:

- a. Equipping and encouraging focus LC Goals for 2019, including Creating a Discipleship Culture versus membership/consumer culture (a need all others concurred with)
- b. Challenges of small and/or rural churches, most of which apply to medium sized churches
 - i. Financial challenges
 - ii. Need to transition to practices and culture of disciplemaking & equipping the saints for ministry, to discern where the Spirit is at work, be creative, relationally based, spiritually strong, embodying Christ, outwardly focused... and how to be adaptive 21st century congregations.
 - iii. Hard to attract pastors, especially 21st century culture equippers
 - iv. Shrinking pool of existing leaders through death and people leaving community
 - v. Fear and/or resistance to adapting for 21st century in local congregations, and pastors and sessions not trained how to lead change see ref. to Bolsinger materials below

II. Steps we are taking to provide strong pastoral leadership and equip other for pastorless congregations:

- A. Aiding the search: George is contacting seminaries and working with the placement office to publicize our vacancies.
- B. Publicizing the calling, opportunity and need for CRE's. Working with PMT on giving prayerful thought to varied aspects of training, preparation and oversight:

Margee Smith, Lewiston. Formal coursework complete. Several others expressing interest or praying about whether God may be leading them to explore this training and calling.

- C. Training lay leaders in Jordan, monthly. Lewistown on Spiritual Formation and direction, at their request.
- D. Rethinking curriculum for training. Some of the material is dated for equipping leaders for the church of the 21st century. It's no longer 1960! The overwhelming need is for what can be called a missional mindset modeling Christ and sent OUTSIDE the church to join in Christ's mission versus the old "attraction" model.

Interestingly, in small towns the people can be very missional with eyes, hearts for meeting needs, relating and embodying Christ in the community, but may need training to share the Good News and their own story/testimony of faith and God at work in their lives and ways to adapt as a church.

- iii. Search committees need to be informed about the new realities and needs trends in mission and ministry as they begin to search for a pastor trained to equip and help them navigate these trends into fruitful ministry and mission. Usually this requires a fresh study of scripture and their community to discern God's mission/vision for them NOW. Gospels and Acts helpful here.
- E. Observation: two of our pastorless churches are numerically growing without clergy pastoral leadership: Hysham and St. Andrew.
- F. Regional or cluster equipping is more important than ever. LC offering opportunities in September.

- G. <u>Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory</u>, by Rev. Dr. Tod Bolsinger (PCUSA pastor, trainer, seminary prof.) All day training for PCUSA's Synod of the Trinity, Philadelphia Presbytery and regional ELCA in Feb. 2019
 - 4 video presentations, 4 podcasts for download. I have heard a previous version of this at PCUSA events and watched several of these. Very important to understand and practice.

What Brings Change? * Relate (new communities)

- * Repeat (new practices)
- * Reframe (new ways of thinking)
- * "Shifting"

Radical = change at the root (Not "tweaking!" or "improving" the ways we have been doing it)

God's Opportunity for adapting leaders and church cultures for effective ministry in these new and shifting times. We need to be equipped and proactive NOW, as urgency of our churches is acute. Some will not be viable in 3-5 years with approaching pastor transitions, .

Kathy's Observations of urgency focused after preaching and meeting with some of our church leaders:

- a. Financial and membership crises are God's opportunities. We need to be ready for, catalysts for change which most will never consider or do unless desperate, "We can't go on as we are".
 (pain of staying the same and dwindling/dying is now worse than that of growth and change with its pain, unknowns and loss).
- b. A Need for Vision, Hope, cultivating spiritual growth/roots, being good neighbors locally, globally.
- c. Need to discover, develop a new culture and way of being church for 21st century, and start to live into it or only a chaplain/caretaking, old school pastor will be interested, further accelerating decline.
- d. Essential to live and grow and discern God's mission before and while finishing MIF, calling of a pastor.
- e. A culture of Lay equipping, training and ALL in ministry according to gifts is essential in all churches.
- f. Important for LC and PMT to communicate and collaborate on this, which is starting.

Recall Two National Needs within the church from the Heath Rada Moderatorial Term:

- a. **Improvement of Preaching –** Thus preaching cohort
- **b.** <u>Improvement of Spiritual Formation A request from Lewistown Church....</u> Do we need to provide training for pastors in spiritual formation and then group spiritual direction?

BUT- Also living God's concerns for compassion, righteousness, justice, as we respect the many and varied ways our diverse presbytery may see as best to live out their faith in addressing them

- a. Immigration
- b. Economic plight of ranchers and farmers caught in the trade wars. (see Bozeman Chronicle article 4/7)
- c. Our shrinking, underserved Rural Communities who grow our food, protect our land
- d. d. Stewarding creation (Gen 1) Environment Climate Change and various pollutions; i.e. impact of longer summers...
- e. Racism in our bounds: Native American and Anglo and Latino,

Different congregation should be asking this question in its local and cultural contexts... And the, with God's leading and prompting, do it.
- b. **Spiritual Conflict:** From Job 2 to Jesus himself, to Ephesians 6 and Revelation, the Scriptures are clear that we are embroiled in the unseen, epic spiritual battle of good and evil. What evidence do we see of this in our day? How might God be leading us to better understand, be equipped for and live out this part his commission to disciples(Luke 9, Mt. 10...)? What might be the consequences if we do not? See Andrews' article in May/June *Presbyterians Today*.

St. Timothy's Memorial Chapel Committee (STMCC) Report to Yellowstone Presbytery March – 2019

Information -

2018 Summer Worship – We had a total of 446 worshipers in attendance at our 13 worship services. This is a minimal increase over those present in 2016. However, the Offering was \$5,350 – a 20% increase over 2016.

Columbarium – Plans are to develop a brochure on the columbarium for distribution and to place that brochure on our web site.

Chapel Roof – The Chapel was reroofed in September.

2019 Pastors – For years we have

Rev. Andrew Mullins – All of June.

Rev. Dr. Paul Hayden, All of July and August.

Music Concerts – Five Music Concerts are scheduled for 2019.

Weddings – Seven weddings are currently scheduled for 2019.

2019 Maintenance Projects – Next spring we are faced with a number of maintenance projects. While many are small we need to replace the pump for the well at a cost of near \$9,000. Estimated costs for all projects are included in the budget adopted by the committee.

Action items –

1. The St. Timothy's Memorial Chapel Committee requests that the presbytery rescind the St. Timothy's Financial Procedures document.

When the revised document was approved by the presbytery in May of 2018 I commented that the Management Group, after a year or two of experience may bring a recommendation to Presbytery to rescind the document.
