The camp schedule has been adjusted to allow senior high youth to attend camp and to participate in the Presbyterian Youth Triennium trip. We have noted in previous reports the progress on cutting down dead and hazardous trees on the grounds of Westminster Spires. Our caretaker, Simon Hill, has done an outstanding job of working with the Forest Service on identification of trees that need to be removed. We have paid Simon beyond his caretaker duties for the additional work at a rate of \$10 per hour. To this point, we have been able to cover the additional compensation for Simon's extra tree cutting duties with donations. I expect we will be able to keep this project on track without an additional request to Presbytery.

I will be exploring the possibility of adding a tree seedling planting program to our summer camp schedule so we can begin to renew the forest. We will work with the Forest Service to gain their approval and support. This would be a great way to get our campers directly involved in the stewardship of our environment.
