Dear Yellowstone Presbytery family,

Keeping 'the main thing the main thing'. The 'main thing'- Living our vision, seeking to embody-creatively, faithfully, and fruitfully-- God's preferred future as an outpost of Christ's church called, gathered, equipped, and sent in Montana. In reliance on Prayer, Scripture and the Holy Spirit, it is our call with you to develop and nurture missional, disciple-making, disciple-sending congregations and leaders. Together, we seek to help congregations and each other be all we can be in Christ -- joining Christ's mission. Fulfilling Christ's vision and call is not merely about the words of a statement. It is about cooperating with God transforming who we are and how we live, for Jesus' sake, sent out in these changing and challenging times in Montana and around the world. Passing of Amendment 10-A: Our letter of last week talked about the change in the process and wording regarding ordination standards in 10-A which will take effect July 10. On Saturday we will take some time as a community regarding this. Communication in print has many limitations and it is important for us to be face to face for prayer and conversation on these difficult matters, as hard as that may be George will give a brief presentation & facilitate prayerful opportunity to discuss & listen to the Holy Spirit, to one another.

## Goals of that time include-

- 1. Information and clarity regarding the new polity & implications resulting from passage of 10-A
- 2. Focus us all on Jesus Christ who is the head of the church and who promises us the peace that passes all understanding as we give Jesus our anxieties, Philippians

3. Continue the conversation, including sifting consequences & possible options in light of the complexities and totally new territory the new polity sets up

We are both grateful & proud of how we as the body of Christ have chosen to handle our intense feelings and disagreements as we discussed and voted on this amendment at our February meeting. May we continue in this prayerful, humble Christ-like spirit, keeping in mind: If someone walked into the room at presbytery during this conversation would they know that we belong to and honor Jesus from how we talk and conduct ourselves? Restrained and respectful conversation which does not impune or assuming motives or convictions

A gradual, prayerful working through allows congregations and usall to continue focusing on strengthening disciple-making churches and not allow this to distract us.
