Another example of going out in partnership w/ other churches & denominations: Love, Inc. in greater Bozeman area

Native American reservations – how to partner here? Contact Dakota presbytery and get facts Prison ministry – Deer Lodge, Billings (women's) to & with inmates, families including -

'sojourning' families living nearby, visiting families

Students & campusus 16-28 age range - charateristics &/or needs of this age group include;

Transient population; Need: consistent leadership & can communicate well here – media

Their schedules and times are scattered; Some specific felt needs-food, conversation, dialogue consumer generation; How to make connections across generations, share advice...be available for questions; Needs- i.e. change my tires, rides to church;

Help **do** with them – greater needs now

Low income people i.e. those receiving food stamps may need toilet paper and cleaning supplies. Identify those in need

Think globally-school kits, gloves, supplies, coats, bicycles

Youth ministry-equip and train congregations in smaller communities, share curriculum... Share people, equip, [equip & encourage] Partner

Needed: a Resource bank and match up (computer)
