We look at The Emotional Impact of Crisis as well as the Disaster Cycle and maintaining the mission of the church the goal of which is: "To enable the body of Jesus Christ to continue to function in a viable way before, during and after disaster." While we couldn't do it this year, next year the women of PW of the Yellowstone hope to qualify to receive a certificate as "Courageous Congregations" by signing the pledge at wewillspeakout.us/take-action and complete one other action:

- 1. Preach, about sexual or gender-based violence
- 2. Teach a class or workshop about sexual or gender-based violence 3. Hold a service of healing for victims/survivors of sexual or gender-based violence
- 4. Support a mission co-worker and/or a global church partner engaged in work addressing gender-based violence.

We have a new PW Manual- A Guide for PW Groups as a resource and which includes the Churchwide Triennial Strategic Plan.
