I believe in the one true and living God who is revealed in the Trinity – God, whom Jesus called Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. A loving God who is both Creator and Sustainer of the universe, God created humankind for the purpose of relationship. However, humankind turned away from God and because of this rebellion faces certain death and separation from God.

I believe in Jesus Christ who is the living Son of God. Being both fully human and fully God, Jesus lived a perfect life free from sin. It is through his sacrificial death upon a cross that Christ took all of humankind's sin upon himself. Through the power of God, Jesus was resurrected to life and victory over sin and death. There is no other means by which humankind can be redeemed and gain an eternal relationship with God except through the atoning sacrifice of Jesus Christ. This free gift of grace has been offered to all. Those who confess in faith that Jesus is Savior and Lord and turn from their sin shall receive eternal salvation.
