Yellowstone Presbytery's Year of Visioning and Discernment—WHERE ARE WE?

PHASE I

To discover and learn what God is up to in the world today, including our contexts, congregations, and communities.

May '08-Apr '09

- Dwelling in the Word with Sessions, Presbytery, Council, committees/teams
- Presbytery data/stats from Ten Year Report and Persept Report
- Assets, dreams, needs Presbytery Council, committees & congregations (in progress)
- Insights from the Holy Spirit's work from other Christians asking similar questions in 21st Century – PC(USA), other Christians, resources of various kinds, consultant
- Technological and social shifts in communications, media, values, and life styles
- Vision Team presents "Our Iceberg Is Melting" to Presbytery as model for presentation and training in new strategies, practices.

PHASE II

To discern God's vision and role for congregations and presbyteries in the 21st century, especially for the gathering of churches known as Yellowstone Presbytery.

What is God's vision for us?

Apr '09-Sep '09

Phase III

To embody--creatively, faithfully, and fruitfully--God's preferred future as an outpost of his church called, gathered, equipped, and sent in Montana.

How might we live and embody Christ's vision in our life and mission together?

Sep '09—May '10

- Vision Team distills all inputs, drafts vision statement, interacts with Council & May Presbytery
- Vision Team visits clusters of congregations to interpret and discuss vision & priorities
- September vision retreat for leaders in congregations & presbytery vision, priorities, practices
- November Presbytery adopts and celebrates its new vision, further brainstorming, explores partnerships and networks
- Vision Team works on implementation strategies and continues cluster and congregational visits
- February and May presbytery meetings— Presbytery considers implementation strategies.

Gather Together

To glorify God, rooted and grounded in Scripture and prayer

Each time the community of congregations known as Yellowstone Presbytery gathers, we will begin with an extended period of joyful worship and study.

On Friday evening, we'll worship God in word, song, and prayer, and then brainstorm together how we might live this out in our gatherings!

Some possibilities . . .

- Pastor/clp, groups expanded (phone, online and/or in person)
- twice-yearly gatherings for meal, worship, and communion in various locations
- guided online study of particular text/book from Scripture
- weekly prayer concerns distributed by email
- semi-monthly "letter" from a congregation to the Presbytery, sharing what God is doing (up to) among them, calling them to, and asking for prayer (like a letter from one missionary community to another, á la St. Paul's letters)

Your ideas . . .

Equip and Encourage

On Saturday morning, our facilitator, Rev. Marianne Rhebergen, will lead us in indentifying the many gifts we possess for serving God. Then *you* can help brainstorm the kinds of training you need in the future!

Some possibilities . . .

- identify individuals or teams of persons with particular gifts and commission them as ambassadors to provide training for congregations
- develop YP's website as source for online training opportunities
- engage entire presbytery in Martha Grace Reese's <u>Unbinding the Gospel</u> series on evangelism: Real Life Evangelism
- training in spiritual disciplines and practices

Some possibilities . . .

- Listen and learn more about our communities (i.e.) invite leaders, representatives of organizations in the community / region to discuss the needs of our communities;
- encourage congregations to join each other for service projects and evangelism
- challenge each congregation to identify one or two ways in which they can join other organizations in meeting a need in their communities.
- neighborhood and workplace Bible study
- presbytery mission trips & wilderness adventure
- plant new missional fellowships, congregations

GATHER TOGETHER to glorify God, rooted and grounded in Scripture and prayer

Acts2:42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. 43 Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. 44 All who believed were together and had all things in common; 45 they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. 46 Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, 47 praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

EQUIP AND ENCOURAGE congregations and their leaders for living the Gospel

Ephesians 4:11 The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, 12 to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13 until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. 14We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. 15 But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, 16 from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

GO OUT to join Christ in His mission

Luke 10:1 After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. 2 He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. 3 Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. 4 Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. 5 Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' 6 And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. 7 Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. 8 Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; 9 cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' 10 But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 11 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near.' 12 I tell you, on that day it will be more tolerable for Sodom than for that town.
