

Bible Hour Walter Brueggemann

Walter Brueggemann is one of the most influential Bible interpreters of our time. He is the author of over one hundred books and numerous scholarly articles. He has served as faculty at Eden Theological Seminary and Columbia Theological Seminary. He is currently William Marcellus McPheeters professor emeritus of Old Testament at Columbia.



Convocation Andy Crouch

Andy Crouch is a wellknown author, executive director of Christianity Today, and executive producer of This is Our City Group. He serves on the boards of Fuller Seminary and Equitas Group, as well as being a senior fellow of the International Justice Mission's IJM Institute. He is also a classically trained musician and has led musical worship for congregations of 5 to 20,000.



Evening Worship Anne Zaki

Anne Zaki was born in Cairo, Egypt. At age 16 she was selected by the Egyptian government to attend an international school dedicated to peace and international understanding. After graduating she attended Calvin College, where she learned to integrate her faith and her dedication to social justice. Anne currently teaches at the Evangelical Theological Seminary in Cairo, Egypt. She is also going through the ordination process in the Presbyterian Church of Egypt; if successful, she would be the first woman to be ordained as a minister in North Africa and the Middle East.
